Intricate Minds promotes harm reduction as a road to recovery

It may be the only place in Springfield where a person can get a haircut and a meth pipe for free.

Intricate Minds provides free hypodermic needles and pipes to those struggling with addiction as part of a harm-reduction strategy designed to reduce the spread of disease.

“We provide clean syringes and pipes. We have Narcan and fentanyl test strips. I want to keep people who are in active use safe,” said Tiara Standage, who founded the nonprofit in March 2023 and recently relocated it to a storefront at 619 North Grand Ave.

Her organization provides a variety of services to at-risk populations ranging from mentally ill people to homeless individuals to those struggling with substance abuse.

The center also gives away condoms, pregnancy tests, Plan B and hosts a class called “Period Pooh.”

“It’s an educational class to teach young ladies about their bodies, their periods and sexual health. And we just recently partnered with Planned Parenthood,” said Standage. “We give away clothes and shoes, hygiene kits, we do free haircuts on Monday. We have several support groups,” she said. Among them is a men’s mental health group and one for adult children of people who abuse drugs and alcohol.

It’s a subject that hits too close to home for Standage, who lost her mother to a fentanyl overdose.

“It wasn’t surprising. She was an active user almost all of my life. It’s hard to talk about sometimes, but when you have a family member that’s an active user, you’re always trying to get them to rehab and get them the help they need. Sometimes it works and sometimes it doesn’t,” she said.

“I wish I would have known the principles

of harm reduction that I know now. When my mother was still alive, I was just always taught if she’s not clean to stay away. And that’s exactly the opposite of what harm reduction is. Harm reduction is meeting people wherever they’re at in their addiction. Some people aren’t ready to stop using drugs. With harm reduction, abstinence from drugs is not a requirement for help,” Standage said.

Not everyone is so sanguine about her approach.

She said Intricate Minds was forced to

vacate its previous location in the Southtown neighborhood at South Grand Avenue and 11th Street.

“My neighbors over there and the city didn’t want me there doing harm reduction,” Standage said. “I opened on Dec. 1 as a community center and not even a couple weeks later, I had seven city inspectors in there. We passed the inspection. And (there was) just a lot of back-and-forth from the city and my landlord.”

She said she was asked to leave by her landlord.

Ward 2 Ald. Shawn Gregory, who represents the Southtown area, said there was concern that homeless people were congregating around the center and that it might become a shelter. Also, there was a fear that discarded needles might litter the neighborhood.

“I just don’t want to see that all over Southtown,” he said. “We’re trying to get things cleaned up.”

Gregory said that, like Standage, he also has personal experience with family members who used drugs. “I get the services that she provides, and I respect those services. Both my parents were on drugs. I grew up in a foster home all my life. So, I get what she’s trying to do,” he said. “I’m not educated on harm

reduction. I don’t know enough about it to be a fan or be against it.”

The concern is without merit, said Sara Bowen-Lasisi, who volunteers for Intricate Minds and has experience in harm reduction and public health.

“It’s not valid in any way, shape or form. Harm reduction is evidence-based. It’s not something I have to convince anybody that works,” she said. “There’s plenty of research and evidence that shows that harm reduction absolutely does work without increasing syringe litter within the community as well as not increasing overall drug use in the community. ... People who enter into harm reduction services are three to five times more likely to seek out abstinence-based recovery.”

Bowen-Lasisi said the center has been welcomed in the Enos Park neighborhood.

“These are humans; they’re people, they need love and attention and compassion, just like your average person who does not use drugs,” said volunteer Tami Griggs.

“So if you give them that same attention and compassion and treat them like a human, then you can meet them where they’re at and hopefully lead them to a road to recovery.” □

Home alone

Foster parents left three children, age 10, 7 and 4, unattended. The 7-year-old drowned.

The swimming pool drowning death of Barrett Koches, 7, who police say was left at his foster home without adult supervision, has launched investigations by local detectives and state child protection investigators.

Barrett, his brother Ryder, 4, and an unrelated 10-year-old boy were alone at a home on Winnebago Drive in Springfield March 16 when the drowning occurred. One of the boys sought help from a passerby who called 911. Responding officers located the 7-year-old in the deep end of the pool, submerged and unresponsive. The child was taken by ambulance to HSHS St. John's Hospital emergency room where he was declared dead at 1 p.m.

Springfield Police Chief Ken Scarlette said, "While the investigation is still in the infancy stages, I can confirm that the three children were at the residence by themselves when first responders arrived at the scene."

According to Sangamon County property records, the residence is the home of David Yankee, 47, and his husband Michael Yankee, 46. Neither responded to telephone messages and texts requesting comment. No criminal charges have been filed in the matter.

David Yankee, a financial adviser, ran unsuccessfully last year for a seat on the Springfield City Council representing Ward 4. According to a campaign statement, he is "an advocate for foster children" and has served on several area nonprofit boards.

Heather Tarczan, communications supervisor for the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services, said in a written statement, "We are deeply saddened by this tragic accident and are conducting an investigation." She said that because of privacy laws she could not comment further.

Sangamon County coroner Jim Allmon said an autopsy was conducted. "Barrett did not show any physical injuries," he said. "His death is consistent with drowning."

Barrett, who formerly lived in Taylorville with his aunt Gina Hartman, was removed from his biological mother's custody in September 2023.

During an interview March 21 at her home, Hartman showed a reporter a tumultuous cellphone video showing police removing Barrett from her residence. Hartman could be heard shouting, "Don't take him. Don't take him." Family members said police used a battering ram to get through the front door

and the adults resisted surrendering the children. The struggle apparently moved to the basement where police were eventually able to peacefully end the situation.

Hartman said her sister, Jamie D. Hartman, 40, lost custody of her children because she had become homeless. Jamie Hartman has a minor criminal record for disorderly conduct and retail theft. DCFS officials are prohibited by law from publicly discussing details of child protection cases.

Reached by phone, Jamie Hartman said she would first check with her attorney before speaking with a reporter. She failed to call back and could not later be contacted. Barrett's father, Jeff Koches, could not be reached.

However, on March 22, Jamie Hartman sent a text to a reporter. It stated, "I can't talk. My family and my other boys need help and protection & Justice!!!! Justice for Barrett! Justice for my babies!!" She did not respond to requests for clarification. Hartman has five surviving children, all boys.

Barrett was initially placed in a foster home in Lincoln where he attended Chester-East Lincoln School and was active in baseball, football, fishing and dirt bike riding. He was on the elementary school wrestling team.

It is not known why Barrett was transferred from the home in Lincoln. Gina Hartman said she believed Barrett had been with the Yankees for several months.

Funeral services were held March 23 at Hough and Sons Funeral Home in Hillsboro with burial in Irving Cemetery. □

Grass is good for land, livestock and livelihoods.

Experts promote regenerative grazing, a new approach to livestock farming.

This economical process makes healthier soil, which makes healthier plants, which makes healthier animals, which makes healthier consumers. So why haven't more livestock farmers adopted the practice of regenerative grazing?

"The answer is really very simple, lack of knowledge and awareness," said Allen Williams, a founding partner of Understanding Ag LLC. "You can't implement what you do not know. Once you are aware and have a clear understanding of how to do this, you're going to do it."

Williams was one of the keynote speakers during the Illinois Grazing Lands Coalition's Inaugural Grazing Conference held March 12-13 in Springfield. The conference informed attendees about improved grazing management and what it could mean for their land, their livestock and their livelihoods. The conference was aimed at anyone who raises livestock, especially beef and dairy cattle, and the presenters showed how a deliberate, planned strategy of moving livestock from one grass feeding area to another, or regenerative grazing, can benefit all levels of the food chain.

The main problem with regenerative grazing is that it's different from the traditional Illinois farming operation where corn and soybeans are king, and cattle are usually nourished with the products of those crops in muddy feedlots.

"Their whole business model, everything about the way they manage, is all predicated on what they have always done," Williams said. "When you're unaware of another way, you often have this reservation about change. It begins with the transformation of the mind before we can transform our practices."

Transforming the mind about grazing is something that Williams does. He is a sixth-generation family farmer and former university professor from Mississippi who has consulted with more than 4,000 farmers and ranchers in the United States, Canada, Mexico, South America and Europe. Williams pioneered many of the grazing techniques he now teaches and he uses ecology, biology, nutrition and economics to make his case for regenerative grazing.

According to Williams, the key to regenerative grazing is shaking things up.

"Modern agriculture lacks diversity. I dislike the term 'sustainability' because there is no sustaining in agriculture," Williams said. "You cannot stay the same. Nature always yields incredible diversity in soil microbes,

macro-organisms, plants and animals. Mother Nature did not grow monocultures, so why should we?"

Regenerative grazing is about farming and ranching in synchrony with nature, Williams said, where you start the focus with life beneath the soil and move to the life above. The planned and varied movement of grazing animals from one paddock, or forage-filled enclosure, to another rejuvenates the growth of soil microbial matter and plant roots. It can help create an additional 14.7 inches of regenerated, healthy soil in just four years.

Williams said healthier soil enhances water infiltration and retention, encourages more plant growth, fosters insect and bird species diversity, and creates better livestock animal health. When livestock is healthier, the consumer who eats the end product gets healthier food as well.

Williams said that modern, non-regenerative agricultural practices since 1940 have depleted the key mineral levels in certain

vegetables by as much as 76 percent and the key mineral levels in meat by as much as 54 percent. By contrast, regenerative grazing practices and the healthier plant and meat products that result contain higher levels of key vitamins, minerals, antioxidant and anti-inflammatory compounds, and healthy fatty acids.

Regenerative grazing can also help the climate. Healthy soils, plants and animals are key parts of the naturally occurring carbon cycle upon which life on earth depends. Williams said regenerative farms are four times more powerful carbon sinks than typical farms and are much more resistant to floods and droughts.

Hugh Aljoe is the director of producer relations at Noble Research Institute in Oklahoma and was one of the keynote speakers at the Grazing Conference in Springfield. Aljoe has firsthand, documented research experience with regenerative grazing.

"We use no herbicides, pesticides or

fertilizer on our farms," Aljoe said. "We move and watch the cattle, we read the land, and we've improved animal and soil health and reduced our feed costs."

Even with those results, Aljoe said it's still a struggle to sway many farmers toward regenerative grazing.

"It's going to take quite a shift in attitudes. You have to convince farmers that it's profitable while being good for the land," Aljoe said. "Farmers are very fond of saying, 'Well, this is what I have learned.' I say, don't unlearn what you have learned, just learn more."

Another conference speaker, Jeremia Markway of central Missouri's Markway Ranch, told the mostly beef-producing crowd that "You raise cows for respectability and raise sheep for profitability." That garnered some chuckles, but Markway used data he had gathered to make the case that regenerative grazing can be less expensive up front and more profitable in the end if producers switched from cattle to sheep in their

percent of the cost of beef cattle.”

Cass County farmer Jim Crum has long practiced regenerative grazing for his grass-fed beef operation near Virginia.

“I have seen the difference between conventional versus regenerative grazing,” Crum said. “The animals are healthier, so you spend less on veterinary medicine, your feed costs are lower, and the health benefits to the consumer are greater.”

Crum, who acknowledged it takes longer to bring grass-fed cattle to market size versus corn-fed, feedlot cattle, said he was encouraged by the people who attended the Grazing Conference.

“I look around the room and I see a lot of younger people here, and I think the younger people are going to influence the others who have been stuck in a rut for so long,” Crum said. “Times are changing, people want healthy outcomes that are good for the environment. I think consumers may help to push more farmers toward regenerative practices.”

Mason County farmer Walter Lynn appreciated the information and guidance that was presented at the Grazing Conference, but he said it will take face-to-face convincing to get most farmers to change what they have been doing for a lifetime.

“It’s a social process where you find a buddy and give him the breakdown, explain the benefits and the cost savings from your own experience,” Lynn said. “You need the right mindset. Moving to the next step is a progression, like climbing stairs.”

“We have been blessed with our land, and this is an opportunity,” Lynn added. “I think we can bring back the soil organic matter to possibly pre-settlement levels. These principles work anywhere in the world. Farmers are farmers.” □

operations.

Either way, Markway said regenerative grazing really has no downside if you know your context, or your own unique agricultural situation, and adapt your practices accordingly.

University of Illinois Beef Extension Specialist Travis Meteer talked about the economic possibilities of regenerative grazing, and said that livestock producers might realize additional income if they can effectively market their grass-fed meats to health-conscious and environmentally conscious consumers.

“Grass can solve a lot of our problems if we know what we are doing,” Meteer said. “Feed costs traditionally account for 60

Don't be fooled by fear tactics. Eliminating money bond is working.

A person's freedom should not depend on how much cash they have. Illinois understands this tenet of fairness, and became the first state to eliminate money bond. The step follows the lead of other jurisdictions who successfully reduced the use of money bond. But rather than celebrating, the move away from money bond has come with fearmongering and misinformation by people wedded to the old system – especially police and many prosecutors with unfettered access to the press.

Implemented six months ago, the Pretrial Fairness Act is a critical step towards a more equitable criminal legal system. It ensures that safety is the main factor determining who is jailed and who is released before trial.

Resorting to fear tactics, opponents of the new law exploit their positions of authority as credible experts on public safety to use limited statistics, extreme outlier cases and outright misinformation to manipulate the public, encouraging a reopening of the discussion about how we handle pre-trial detentions.

We should not be fooled – these doomsayers opposed the end of money bond from long ago – and they are using a predictable playbook.

In 2020, New York ended cash bail for most misdemeanors and nonviolent felonies. Police, prosecutors and politicians opposed reforms from the start, and after implementation blamed rising crime on bail reform. The increase was related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Studies showed that New York's reforms were successful, and people released pretrial were rarely re-arrested, especially for violent crimes. But media repeated misinformation from opponents of the law, and public support for reform diminished. Manufactured fear ultimately fueled rollbacks to the reform.

Illinois' reforms have been successful. Jail populations are decreasing, and crime rates are



not skyrocketing. People no longer are pressured to take a plea to bogus charges just because they want to get out of jail and back to their lives. They can await trial while maintaining their jobs, families and homes.

We must understand that there will be occasional cases where something goes wrong. But we cannot allow one extreme example to shape policy decisions. And, we cannot look at fluctuations in crime rates – based on small sample sizes – to be blamed on ending money bond without considering other factors impacting crime.

The reality is that wealth-based jailing does not make us safer; it increases the likelihood of

rearrests, separates families and makes people lose their jobs and homes. It disproportionately affects low-income and Black and Brown people, funneling money out of their communities, perpetuating the cycle of poverty and incarceration.

Here is the reality. While ending money bond makes communities more stable, it will not end crime and bring public safety to each neighborhood. If we want to improve community safety, we need a holistic approach that addresses the root causes of crime. It will include investments in substance use treatment and behavioral health services, affordable housing, education, and job training programs –

evidence-based solutions that reduce recidivism rates and enhance public safety.

The Pretrial Fairness Act is just one component in building a more equitable and compassionate criminal justice system that prioritizes safety, rehabilitation and community well-being. Residents should be wise enough to resist the fearmongering that always comes from change, and continue to push for policies that uplift and empower all members of society, ensuring a safer and more just future for generations to come. □

Competition for scarce state dollars

Free school meals, summer youth job grants top the list in voter survey

As we've discussed before, the competition for scarce state dollars is particularly fierce this year in Springfield as various groups elbow each other for money while large surpluses and revenue increases start to dry up.

A poll taken by respected national Democratic pollster Normington Petts in late February of 700 registered Illinois voters purports to show which of those ideas has strong support and which do not.

The program with the most respondents saying they "strongly support" it was "Funding free breakfast and lunch to public-school children in grades K through 12, regardless of income. This would cost Illinois about \$200M." The poll found the idea had 64% overall support, with 39% saying they strongly supported it.

The poll was commissioned by a coalition called Healthy School Meals for All Kids, which is pushing for the free school food and was undoubtedly pleased with that result. Thirty-two percent said they opposed the idea, with 17% saying they strongly opposed feeding all kids at school.

Overall, the most-supported proposal was "Giving grants to businesses to provide jobs for young people over the summer to help reduce violence and provide job training in underserved communities. This would cost Illinois about \$150M," at 75%, with 31% registering strong support and just 19% opposed.

The option of "Raising the pay of state-funded home health care workers from \$20 an hour to \$22. This would cost Illinois about \$200M," came out at 68% support, with 35% strongly supporting it and 25% opposing it.

Next up was "A tax credit of \$300 per child for families making less than \$75,000 a year, or \$50,000 if the parent is single. This would cost Illinois about \$300M," at 58% supporting and 35% opposing.

And it may not surprise you to know that at the very bottom of the list was "Expanding the program that provides health insurance to undocumented seniors who would be eligible for Medicare if they were citizens. This would cost Illinois about \$300M," which was opposed by 58% (40% strongly opposed) and supported by a minority of 33%. Proponents, however, said last week they don't have dollar numbers for how much reopening the enrollment to the health insurance program would cost.

When asked to identify their top priority among those five programs, 34% of

respondents said free meals in schools would be their top choice, which led the list. That was followed by summer youth job grants (20%). At the bottom was health insurance for undocumented seniors at only 6%.

The coalition did not supply the poll's full crosstabs, but claimed in an accompanying memo that the free breakfast for all program had majority support across every region, age and partisan demographic.

Its strongest support was among Chicago voters (84%), Democrats (81%) and those 18-44 (74%). Its weakest support was among rural voters (50-46), those age 60+ (51-46) and Republicans (52-44). The coalition did not provide a breakout of 65 and older.

The pollster said the survey was a "hybrid live interviewer landline, mobile, text-to-web and online panel survey conducted among 700 registered voters in Illinois," conducted Feb. 21-26." The margin of error was $\pm 3.7\%$. Party affiliation was 37% Democrat, 37% Independent and 26% Republican.

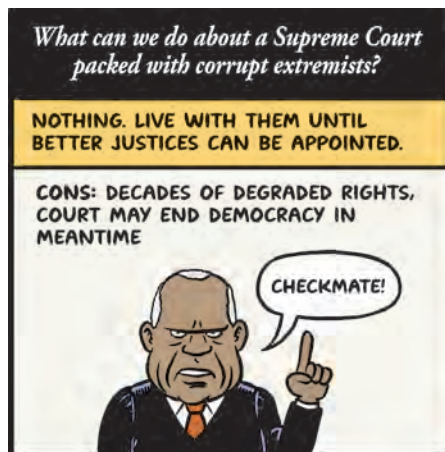
While we're talking about polling results, let's revisit a column I wrote in late 2022.

When Normington Petts asked those same respondents, "What is the single most important problem facing you and your household today?" the top category was "cost of living" at 49%. Crime was the number one issue for just 8% and immigration came in at just 5%.

The Normington Petts poll also found that 27% of Illinoisans thought the state was heading in the right direction, while 60% said it was on the wrong track.

Another recently released poll, taken for the Illinois Education Association by Normington Petts and Republican pollster Next Generation Strategies in late January, found that 32% said the state was on the right track and 58% said it was on the wrong track.

While those results were much better than they were before Gov. JB Pritzker took office (the state bottomed out at a 9% right direction and an 84% wrong track in 2018), the results have dropped way down from a high of 52-48 in an Emerson College poll conducted in October of 2022, which we discussed at the time. □

Photographing history

Lee Milner reflects on his life and career

The date was Jan. 29, 2009, and Pat Quinn was sitting at his desk in the lieutenant governor's office, writing notes for what would become his inaugural speech as governor while the state Senate, one floor above, considered voting to remove Rod Blagojevich from office.

A few feet away, camera in hand, was Springfield resident Lee Milner, capturing the scene from a pivotal moment in Illinois history.

That day's *Chicago Sun-Times* sat on Quinn's desk. The top headline, "His Last Stand," referred to the ultimately futile speech Blagojevich would give in the state Senate chamber in Springfield before senators voted 59-0 to oust the disgraced Democratic governor as the final step of impeachment.

For Milner, who at 64 was volunteering his time as Quinn's photographer and later would send the photographs to the Illinois State Archives, recording history was just his latest efforts at "making a difference."

Throughout his life, he would do just that by harnessing his work ethic, kind personality, self-deprecating humor and wide-ranging experience as a communicator and volunteer for state government, civic groups and nonprofits.

Now 78 and in declining health, Milner, who was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in December 2019, is reflective.

"I'm very fortunate in all kinds of respects," he said. "I'm fortunate in what I've been able to do, who I've been able to meet, who I've been able to help, friends I've met along the way."

Referring to lyrics from a Garth Brooks song, Milner said with a chuckle, "I've got friends in high places, not low places."

He added: "Most of the people I've been around, I've been around leaders, being involved in the issues of the day, watching some very bright people perform. People like me help them stay 'on message' and get things across to the people."

Readers of *Illinois Times* often have seen Milner's work as a freelance photojournalist. But they may not realize they are viewing the work of someone known and respected by people in public life throughout Springfield and beyond for years.

"Lee is a man for all seasons," Quinn, 75, said in a phone interview from Chicago. "He's not a show horse or someone with braggadocio. He's a down-to-earth, caring person. ... I really, really, really enjoyed working with him. He's a lot of fun."

"I think it's a testament to his faith and stamina and just his good nature that he's been

able to battle this disease for as long as he has, and everybody's rooting for him."

Milner was born in Breese, the third of five children born to a Methodist minister father and homemaker mother. He graduated from high school in Bridgeport in Lawrence County and earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Southern Illinois University Carbondale. He worked as a photojournalist for the *Effingham Daily News*, where he met many state lawmakers, before being drafted into the U.S. Army in 1968.

Milner never went overseas where the Vietnam War was raging. He served his two-year hitch as a clerk and photojournalist at Army bases in North Carolina and South Carolina. After discharge, he attended and worked in the public relations office of now-closed MacMurray College in Jacksonville, where one of his brothers was a professor.

After a semester, he got a job at Memorial Health in Springfield as a photographer for a

pathologist, Dr. Grant Johnson, at the recently opened Southern Illinois University School of Medicine.

After several years of taking photos of surgeries, autopsies and Sangamon County coroner's death investigations, Milner moved to Washington, D.C. He began working as a legislative coordinator for former U.S. House member George Shipley, a Democrat from Olney, whom Milner met while working in Effingham.

After a year, Milner returned to Springfield to marry Cindy Young, his wife of 49 years and now a state retiree, whom he met while working for Memorial. They would have two children, James, 39, a filmmaker, and Leanne Sappington, 42, an events director. Milner's children, and his 11-year-old grandson, Leanne's son, all live in the Los Angeles area.

After Milner came back to Springfield from Washington, a legislator friend of his asked then-state Rep. Bill Redmond, a DuPage

County Democrat who had recently been elected speaker of the Illinois House and was building out his staff, to consider hiring Milner.

Milner became Redmond's assistant press secretary and worked for Redmond from 1975 to 1979. During that time, Milner also took night classes at Sangamon State University and obtained a master's degree in public affairs.

"I loved it," Milner said. "It was where the action was. There were some very intelligent, articulate people that went through the House of Representatives and went farther, as a lot of them did. So it was just exciting to be in a position like that and to think you were helping the community by helping people who were trying to do their best. I think that's a place where you can do some real good."

The legislature was a less-partisan place then, he said. It was before the passage of the 1980 Cutback Amendment, backed by Quinn, which reduced the size of the House by one-third. The constitutional amendment

also eliminated three-member districts and cumulative, or "bullet" voting, which often resulted in at least one member of a different party representing a district.

While working for Redmond, Milner witnessed a rapt audience when former Chicago Mayor Richard J. Daley addressed the General Assembly.

A visit to the legislature by then-President Jimmy Carter also was memorable.

"I can't get past his smile," Milner said with a laugh. "He always had the best smile. He was very cordial to everybody, as I recall."

Redmond encouraged Milner to apply to lead the communications office at the Illinois State Board of Education – "not because he wanted to get rid of me, but because he thought it would be a good opportunity," Milner said.

The education agency had been reorganized, and the superintendent of schools became an appointed rather than a statewide elected position.

Milner was hired in 1979 and would work there until his retirement in 2004, serving more than a half-dozen superintendents, including Joseph Cronin, Joseph Spagnolo, Glenn "Max" McGee and Ted Sanders, the father of current State Superintendent Tony Sanders.

Answering questions from reporters could be stressful, especially when the topics involved could make the state board look bad, but Milner said his work with reporters rarely created tension with state superintendents and his other bosses.

"In most cases, we got along just fine and decided how to approach issues," he said. "I knew what the reporters were interested in."

Milner worked for the agency at a time when spokespersons in state government frequently spoke to reporters for attribution, instead of the current practice of frequently resorting to written statements, emails and text messages. Milner said he tried to cultivate professional relationships with the media to promote trust.

"I don't know if I'm cut out for it or not, but it worked out well," Milner said. "I like reporters, and I respect what they do. And the most important thing to think about is what reporters can make out of what you do – the good and the bad."

WBEZ reporter Dave McKinney, a longtime Statehouse reporter for the *Sun-Times*, said Milner "showed utmost professionalism" at the State Board of Education. "His word was gold. He was accessible, and there was never any skepticism on my part that I wasn't being told the truth."

Milner's activities since retirement from the state included volunteer work with WSEC-TV, Illinois State Employees Credit Union, Citizens Club of Springfield and the FBI Springfield Citizens Academy Alumni Association, which named its award of excellence after him.

His freelancing included photos for an Illinois news organization at the 2008 Democratic National Convention in Denver

when then-U.S. Sen. Barack Obama of Chicago was nominated for what would become his first term as president.

Milner said he volunteered his services for Quinn, a Democrat, because the newly sworn-in governor, who ended up serving for six years, didn't have a downstate photographer, and Milner was acquainted with members of Quinn's staff.

"To be frank, I don't think they cared if they had pictures," Milner said, adding that Quinn "was not like a Blagojevich running out there to get his picture taken. His ideas are what he wanted out. I told them, 'If you are in central or southern Illinois, let me know and I'll do what I can.'"

Quinn said he liked having Milner around. "He has a divine gift – his ability to not just take photos but take evocative photos, pictures that really bring out the people at the event and how they look and feel," Quinn said.

"Lee is very discreet," Quinn said. "He's not a loud person. He's very modest and polite and courteous – all the things you teach your kids to be. He embodies that. We're lucky that God sent him our way."

When asked how he would like to be remembered, Milner paused for about 30 seconds, then said: "I certainly would like to be remembered as a good father with successful kids, a good husband, and I suppose a loyal worker, and mostly as a helper." □

For a unique and immersive experience, head downtown to 413 E. Adams St. from 6-9 p.m. March 28 or 29 and see a one-of-a-kind, massive art installation inspired by the rich history and subsequent decay of the Pillsbury Mills site. Everything happening at the Pillsbury site is a result of passionate, tireless and dedicated individuals, notably Chris Richmond and Polly Poskin, who spearhead the nonprofit working on cleanup and redevelopment efforts. So is this downtown exhibit, curated by Robert Mazrim, who has worked with Moving Pillsbury Forward on all of the art-related activities at the site. Mazrim spent 30 years as an archaeologist, but his passion is art, having earned a bachelor's in fine arts from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago. His focus has traditionally been mixed media and canvas, using found objects and debris, manipulating artifacts to place contemporary culture in the past tense.

Mazrim worked with Richmond to create a display of historic items which many people saw in the loading dock area when touring the Pillsbury site last year. These items have all been relocated downtown. For many years, a network of underground graffiti artists had been painting murals at the Pillsbury site in the dark of night. When Richmond and Mazrim encountered two of them on one occasion, the connection evolved into a partnership, not an arrest for trespassing. Mazrim and Richmond embraced the graffiti artists, Shock and Static. This unusual collaboration led to a massive multi-media exhibit in one of the abandoned buildings at the Pillsbury site, and a two-night celebration in November attracted over 1,300 people.

Betsy Dollar, known for her creativity and dynamic leadership related to the arts in Springfield, offered Shock and Static an

apartment for visiting artists in the Springfield Art Association complex, where she serves as executive director. In true Springfield fashion, where everyone knows someone who is connected to someone else, conversations led to Chris Nickell agreeing to offer unused space in one of his downtown buildings for the PILLSBURIED exhibit project. Nickell owns seven buildings within a block of the Old State Capitol. He is supportive of the arts and committed to making downtown more attractive.

Mazrim says the show comes from the environmental and social tragedy of the Pillsbury site. The intent is to bring

something redeeming from the rubble. Just as the copper, steel and aluminum have been salvaged from the site, the aesthetic materials and building ruins are being salvaged and repurposed. Dollar says Mazrim has a very keen eye for the more current movement in contemporary art and is pushing the envelope of what people in Springfield see as art. She also says both Shock and Static are taking their graffiti art to a much higher level than standard tagging with logos.

There are brownfield sites all over the country in various stages of cleanup. However, Springfield is unique in having a brownfield reclamation site with an active art program. Mazrim is fascinated with abandoned buildings and urban landscapes. Working with graffiti artists has added a sense of immediacy to his work. He says there is a pulse in abandoned buildings that is further energized when art is added. That pulse has now been brought to a new place.

Relics, decayed history, emotion, aesthetics and disintegration are all elements of the narrative of PILLSBURIED. Andy Warhol once famously said, "Art is what you can get away with." Mazrim said, "This is the purest, most honest art I've been involved with. It is art for art's sake."

What happens next is uncertain. Mazrim curated this exhibit out of a labor of love, with support from other creatives and entrepreneurs. All of this is temporary. No one is getting paid. Experience the energy and mystery for yourself on March 28 and 29. Admission is free, although donations to support the artists are encouraged and art will be for sale. For more information, contact rmazrim@gmail.com. □

Moving Pillsbury Forward is hosting free, one-hour public tours of the former Pillsbury site on Saturday, April 6, and Saturday, April 13, at noon and 2 p.m. These are the last scheduled tours. Any future tours will be dependent on contractor schedules related to demolition. Tours begin at the south dock entrance at the corner of 16th Street and Phillips Avenue. Parking is available in the adjacent south lot and along 15th Street. No reservations are needed.

Tours are in and around buildings on a generally level concrete surface. Sturdy shoes or boots are recommended. The tours focus on the historic Pillsbury era at the site and include information gathered by interviewing former Pillsbury employees. The tours will also highlight street/graffiti art created by artists. To support the surrounding community, guests are encouraged to bring food donations for the Pillsbury neighborhood micropantry.

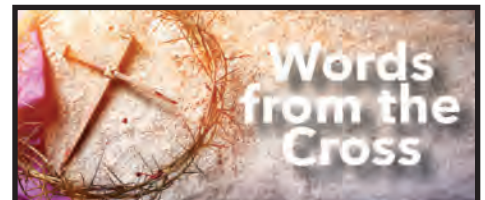

A cheese-based dessert for Easter

Enjoy paskha on paska for Pascha

Though I don't have any Slavic or Orthodox Christian roots, my family has been making a rich cheese-based dessert called paskha every Easter for decades. Paskha is a traditional Eastern Orthodox dish resembling a crustless cheesecake. It is served after the "breaking of the fast" at the end of Lent. We first read about paskha when we were in college in the 1969 Time-Life *Foods of the World* cookbook series and it has been an Easter tradition in the Glatz household ever since.

My late wife and former *Illinois Times* food columnist, Julianne, wrote about paskha in her IT column in 2011. In her recipe notes, she wrote that paskha was traditionally made with farmer cheese, which she wasn't able to find, so she substituted whole-milk ricotta. Paskha is usually made in a decorative truncated pyramid-shaped mold called a pasotchnitza, which she was also unable to locate, so she made her paskha in an inverted flowerpot. My family loves the ricotta version, but I wondered if a more authentic version made with farmer cheese would be superior, so I set to work to find out.

It got confusing when it came to terminology. I did a Google search and found out that paskha (with a "k") is the Ukrainian Easter cheese dish. Paska (with the "k" but without the "h") is a Ukrainian sweet yeast bread, studded with nuts and raisins, also known as kulich. It gets even more confusing: Pascha (with a "c" and "h" but without a "k") is the Eastern Orthodox name for Easter, which is celebrated on May 5 this year, as opposed to our Western Easter which falls on March 31. Paskha (the cheese) is traditionally spread on paska (the bread) to be served on Pascha (the holiday). Both the paskha and the paska are taken to church before Pascha, to be blessed by the priest. Confusing? You bet!

For the 40 days preceding the Eastern Orthodox Easter, the consumption of meat, eggs, butter or other dairy products is forbidden. On Easter Sunday, when the fast has ended, followers are again allowed to eat these "forbidden" ingredients and this is why many of the Easter dishes contain eggs, butter, cheese and cream. Making paskha was a way of using up all the eggs and dairy products that had accumulated during the fast.

Paskha molds are traditionally made from wood and can be quite expensive, but I was able to find a plastic pasotchnitza on Amazon for less than \$10. The elusive Ukrainian farmer cheese took a bit more of a hunt. It is known

as tvorog and it has a texture that is somewhat drier than American cottage cheese and a flavor that is somewhat tangy like a mild chevre. Tvorog is eaten as a breakfast cheese with sweet accompaniments like jam and honey. I was very excited to learn that Prairie Fruits Farm and Creamery in Champaign employs a Ukrainian cheesemaker, Tetyana Dyadechko, who has been making authentic Ukrainian farmer cheese from Kilgus Farmstead Jersey cow milk. I got up early on a Saturday morning to drive to the Champaign-Urbana Winter Farmers Market to buy Prairie Fruits Ukrainian Farmers Cheese to use for my paskha; only later did I discover that Springfield's Food Fantasies sells Ukrainian-style farmer cheese made by Lifeway, an American kefir company founded by Michael Smolyansky, a Ukrainian Jewish immigrant.

Paskha

8-10 servings

Depending on the size of your mold, you may have extra paskha mixture. If so, line a mesh strainer with more cheesecloth and spoon in the remaining mixture to make a second smaller paskha.

Ingredients:

2 pounds fresh farmer cheese, room temperature
3 sticks unsalted butter, room temperature
1 cup heavy cream
6 egg yolks, room temperature
1 ½ cups sugar
¼ teaspoon grated fresh nutmeg
Zest of 1 orange
1/2 cup coarsely chopped almonds
1/2 cup golden raisins
1 vanilla bean, seeds scraped out

For decorating (optional):

Toasted nuts
Sliced or chopped fresh or candied fruit, for garnish

Also needed:

Cheesecloth
Paskha mold (pasotchnitza) or a clean 6-inch flower pot

Preparation:

Press the farmer cheese through a sieve or food mill and set aside.

Melt the butter and let it cool down thoroughly. When cool, combine with the cheese.

Heat the cream in a heavy pan until small bubbles start to form around edge of the pan.

In a mixing bowl, beat the egg yolks and sugar with a whisk or mixer until thickened and a ribbon falls from the whisk. Stirring constantly, add the hot cream in a thin stream to the egg/sugar mixture, then return the mixture back into the pan. Stirring constantly, cook over low heat until thickened. Do not allow to boil. When thick enough to coat a spoon, remove from heat.

Combine egg/sugar/cream with the cheese/butter mixture and mix until fluffy and smooth.

Add the nutmeg, orange zest, almonds, raisins, and vanilla seeds; stir to combine.

Set the paskha mold (or 6-inch clay flowerpot), with the small end downward, on a cake rack over a bowl. Cut a double thickness of cheesecloth large enough to line the mold, with an extra four inches extending beyond the rim. Dampen the cheesecloth with hot water and line the mold.

Carefully spoon the cheese mixture into the mold or pot, pressing to remove any air pockets. Fold the ends of the cheesecloth over the top of the cheese and set a weight (such as food cans) on top to squeeze out the whey.

Let the cheese mixture stand and drain for one hour unrefrigerated. Pour off any liquid whey and transfer to the refrigerator to continue to drain overnight. You might need to pour off the whey a couple of times.

The next day, remove the weights and pull back the cheesecloth. Place an upside-down serving plate over the top of the mold. Holding the platter firmly against the mold, turn over the mold and the platter. Carefully remove the mold and lift away the cheesecloth. If the paskha comes apart during the unmolding, it probably needed to drain more. If this happens, you can try to piece it back together with a spatula and cover up any defects with the garnishes. It will still taste wonderful!

Decorate with nuts and fresh or candied fruit. Tightly wrapped, paskha can be refrigerated for four to five days or stored in the freezer for up to three months. □

John Mellencamp more than rocks

John Mellencamp brought his *Live and in Person 2024* tour to the Sangamon Auditorium at the UIS Performing Arts Center on March 23. Most in attendance were likely longtime fans, since the majority seemed closer to his age of 71 than not, with a smattering of younger folks here and there joining in with the late-blooming baby boomers. Overall, the performance was profoundly good and well-paced, covering major hits and minor cuts with a couple of acoustic numbers, along with a few surprises for a rock concert setting.

Our first surprise was a “no alcohol sales” sign at the concession stands, something many people found unusual for a Saturday night concert. Another rather odd occurrence, at least to me and others at the UIS show – although I’ve since learned this is now common practice – was the removal of water bottle caps by the vendors after purchases.

Whatever the reasons for these choices, the lights dimmed promptly at 8 o’ clock and a video began on a screen hanging above the stage. For the next 20-plus minutes we watched scenes from six classic black and white movies such as *The Fugitive Kind*, *Giant* and *The Grapes of Wrath*. By the time we reached the third clip, there were definite disgruntled sounds from the crowd. Finally, at the end a message appeared on the screen written in old typewriter font: “Please exercise theater etiquette. Thank you.”

With that over, siren sounds and flashing red lights accompanied the band to the stage. They proceeded loud and proud with Mellencamp chewing on his ever-present gum while singing with force and confidence. He shook his fist, strutted the stage in his now-standard work coveralls and directed the band in fine fashion with energy and enthusiasm.

We wondered about the mannequins on stage and a New Orleans-looking street corner backdrop, but as Mellencamp and his longtime bandmates left no stone unturned in rockin’ the house, nothing really mattered to an appreciative audience but the constant music through a several song set.

After a blistering “Check it Out,” the band left the stage and Mellencamp strapped on an acoustic guitar and donned a harmonica in a rack around his neck. He announced his next song was “about the homeless problem in America” and launched into a plaintive rendition of “The Eyes of Portland” from his

acclaimed 2023 *Orpheus Descending* album. During the song he was very forceful on a few lyrics, shouting out parts of these phrases, “In this land of plenty *where nothing gets done*” and “*Living here in the gutters* in this land of the free,” demonstrating his outspoken support of this issue. He finished the acoustic set joined by band members doing “Jack and Diane” while the crowd sang along to practically every word.

Our next surprise came when, after that, Mellencamp left the stage (smoke break, says the cynic in me) and fiddler Lisa Germano told the audience, “John wanted to make

these shows a little more deeper and intimate.” After she explained that Mellencamp was good friends with Hollywood couple and actors the late Paul Newman and Joanne Woodward, we heard Germano and accordionist Troy Kinnett accompany Woodward, who now suffers from Alzheimer’s and is unable to speak, reciting Mellencamp lyrics she recorded years ago. The session lasted about four minutes, then the star of the show returned with a killer version of “Rain on the Scarecrow,” much to the delight of his fans.

From there the concert continued jamming along through several hit songs, including an extended “Crumblin’ Down” highlighting the superb musicians in his band who then flawlessly segued into an anthemic version of “Pink Houses” that had the house singing and swaying along. Next came heartfelt band introductions and a pleasant, jovial, honest talk to the audience about growing old, before “Cherry Bomb” was proclaimed to be the final tune.

After that, with a surprise shout of “It’s time to go home,” they laid hard into “Hurts So Good” for the actual last number. And if there was one more surprise, it was no chance for an encore as the house lights came up immediately upon the band’s exit from the stage. Mellencamp, the last to leave, gave many taps to his heart, waves to the crowd and even a few prayer hand clasps to his chest before heading off to have a smoke and travel on down the road to the next show. □

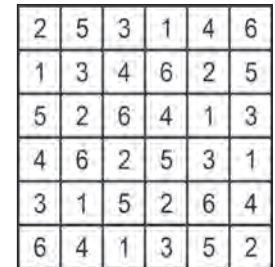

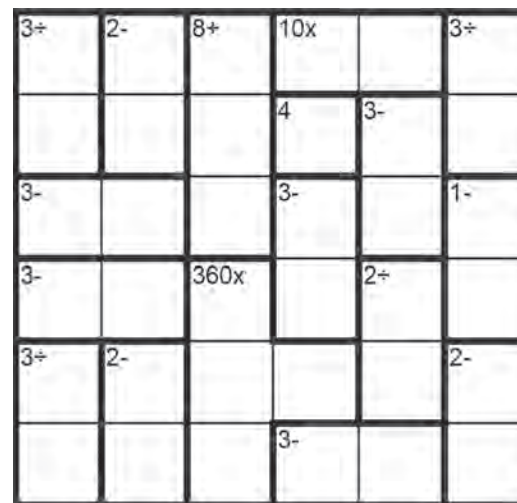

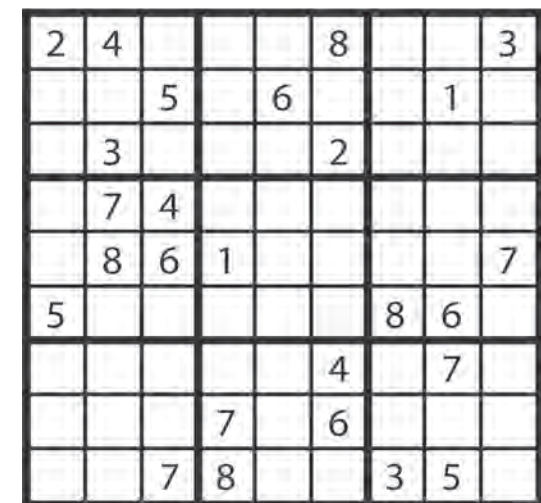
