# Crisis pregnancy centers in the spotlight

Memorial pulls support, citing concerns about creating barriers to care

Memorial Health System will no longer provide financial or in-kind support to crisis pregnancy centers, which counsel against abortions, *Illinois Times* has learned.

The system, which operates hospitals in Springfield, Lincoln, Taylorville, Decatur and Jacksonville, made this decision after the organization's diversity, equity and inclusion team found that crisis pregnancy centers can "exacerbate health inequities and create barriers to care," according to a memo obtained by *IT*.

"These are thought of as deceptive organizations and there's a lot of ethical concerns with them," said a person familiar with the internal debate who asked not to be identified.

System spokeswoman Angie Muhs said, "Memorial Health has determined to focus its limited resources on activities and partnerships closely aligned with our mission to improve health and contribute to our ongoing work in health equity."

Crisis pregnancy centers have become high-profile players in the national debate over abortion rights.

Ralph Rivera, legislative chair for Illinois Right to Life, said these centers do not engage in deception and are dedicated to providing pregnant women and girls with alternatives to abortion. He added that advice their opponents label as "deceptive" often just involves differences of opinion.

"There are risks to abortions," he said.

"And they're not saying there aren't any, but they're saying they're being overstated by crisis pregnancy centers. ... Our studies and their studies may disagree. That's not a deceptive thing. That's just stating what our studies have

found."

The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists contends crisis pregnancy centers "represent themselves as legitimate reproductive health care clinics providing care for pregnant people but actually aim to dissuade people from accessing certain types of reproductive health care, including abortion care and even contraceptive options."

On July 27, Gov. JB Pritzker signed a law banning crisis pregnancy centers from

using "misinformation, deceptive practices, or misrepresentation" to interfere with access to abortion services or emergency contraception. Attorney General Kwame Raoul championed the legislation, which would have allowed his office to investigate complaints against crisis pregnancy centers and fine violators up to \$50,000.

Less than a week later, a federal judge blocked the law from taking effect after antiabortion advocates contended it threatened their rights to free speech and expression. In his ruling, U.S. District Judge Iain Johnston said the new law "is painfully and blatantly a violation of the First Amendment."

Crisis pregnancy centers often provide clothing, baby supplies, emergency shelter and parenting classes to new and expectant mothers. The centers also provide sonograms, enabling individuals to see fetuses.

"What the other side says is, it is just a blob of tissues," Rivera said. "It's important for them to see the humanity of this unborn child."

But part of the concern Memorial's diversity, equity and inclusion team had is that sonograms are not necessarily being used for diagnostic purposes.

"The only point of the sonogram is for them to be able to show a heartbeat and try to have the person develop an emotional tie to her pregnancy," said the person familiar with Memorial's internal discussions.

That person said of Memorial's contributions: "It has not been a substantial donation. It's essentially been in-kind donations for things like gloves, sonogram jelly, lubricant."

Elmi Patton, executive director of First Step Women's Center, a Springfield crisis pregnancy center that has received help from Memorial, issued this written statement about the hospital system's new policy: "We are grateful to Memorial's support of First Step Women's Center over the years; they have generously provided First Step Women's Center with office and medical supplies. This allowed us to focus more of our energy on our mission of providing vulnerable women who are pregnant medical services at no cost and giving these women the answers, kindness and support they need, which in turn empowers them and fills them with confidence. We are thankful another medical organization has since partnered with us, providing these supplies, so working together, we can improve lives and build stronger communities." □

# **Springfield native sets shot-putting record**

Last month, Chase Ealey, the 29-year-old daughter of a Riverton truck driver, won the world shot putting championship in Budapest, Hungary, and earlier this month set the U.S. record in Oregon.

The win in Budapest marked the second year in a row that the Springfield native snagged the world championship – the only times an American has captured the top honor.

Chase Ealey is the daughter of Chuck Ealey of Riverton and Michelle Martinez of Los Alamos, New Mexico. She currently lives in England, where she is training for the 2024 Paris Olympics.

"She's the favorite for the Olympics in Paris, but she was also in 2020 in Tokyo," her mother said.

"In 2020, she didn't do good," her father said. "And then she got COVID. She got sick and she was really doing bad. So, she hooked up with a friend and ended up going to England. She parted ways with her coach and (then she) got with that coach in England, and she has just skyrocketed since then."

The 5-foot 10-inch, 207-pound athlete can hurl an 8.82 pound shot more than 68 feet.

"She's more of a girly girl throwing shots," Martinez said of her daughter. "She just wants to further the sport and show girls that you can be strong and you can be feminine. I tease her by calling her a 'girly girl' because I'm a tomboy. My hair is in ponytails. I wear cowboy boots. I live on a ranch and kind of smell like my horses. Chase, she likes to do her hair, her makeup, her nails. She likes to dress up and she likes to look pretty, but she can get down and dig a hole with me, too."

Chase's father put it this way: "She's big and burly – I hate to say it – but she still wants to be prissy, too."

Chase's parents met while Chuck Ealey was

stationed in the U.S. Army at White Sands Missile Range in New Mexico. After being discharged, they moved to Sangamon County, where Chase was born. She lived in Riverton until she was 3 years old, when her parents divorced. She then moved with her mother to Los Alamos, which is where the first atomic bomb was developed.

"People said our girls' track team was so good because they were 'atomic-powered,'" Martinez recalled. "Chase spent her summers and holidays in Riverton after the divorce," she added.

In high school, Chase was a standout athlete.

"She was a thrower and a runner," Ealey said of his daughter. "She's won the New Mexico shot-put championship and the 100-meter-dash championship in the same year."


She later competed for the Oklahoma State University Cowgirls, where she earned a degree in psychology.

"We just bawled when she won the world championship the first time. I couldn't believe it, because she wasn't throwing good. She just never seemed to throw good at the right times," Ealey said. "She kind of was hurt and wasn't throwing good. And then she got the world championships and threw decent."

While Chase is the reigning world champion, the world record in the women's shot put was set in 1987 by Soviet athlete Natalya Venediktovna Lisovskaya who threw 74 feet, 3 inches. It was an era when allegations of performance-enhancing drugs plagued eastern European female athletes. But accusations against Lisovskaya were never substantiated.

In January, Chase is slated to wed British strongman Mitch Jackson. □

# Notti Favero returns to the Lanphier gridiron at age 100

Will be honored with other veterans in the Route 66 Mother Road Festival parade

Lanphier High School graduate Renato Favero, of Springfield, returned for an alumni football game on Aug. 27, which also happened to be his 100<sup>th</sup> birthday. He took a handoff on his one and only play and, with a little assistance, advanced a few yards and not only crossed the goal line for a two-point conversion but spiked the ball for emphasis.

Current Lanphier football coach Don Goff led the assembled crowd and cheerleaders in singing "Happy Birthday" to Notti, one of his nicknames, along with Not, Notto and Sarge. It was a weekend of celebrations for Favero's high school and family, with memories flowing. The 1941 Lanphier graduate also played baseball and basketball, later got into softball, golf and bowling, and counts the late Robin Roberts, baseball Hall of Famer and fellow Lanphier graduate, as a childhood friend.

"At 16 you had to keep in shape, work hard and keep your grades up," Favero noted. "My mom wouldn't let me play if I didn't keep my grades up."

Favero's younger brother, Rudy, was a three-sport standout at Lanphier who later officiated high school and college sports and was inducted into the Springfield Sports Hall of Fame in 1995.

The 10th of 11 children born to Italian immigrants, Favero still lives within a half-mile of where he grew up on Springfield's north side. As the only one still living, he says it is hard getting used to his siblings no longer being here

Not long after graduating from Lanphier in 1941 and beginning his career, he was drafted into the U.S. Army during World War II.

Favero said his mom would not let him enlist because "war just kills kids your age." He was promoted to sergeant and served as an Army combat engineer in Belgium, France, Holland, Germany and Denmark, with a specialty in building bridges, repairing roads and removing minefields. Favero will be honored for his veteran status by being in the lead car

of the International Route 66 Mother Road Festival parade, which takes place Sept. 22 in Springfield.

He met his future wife, Rita, at a baseball game at Lincoln Park, and they were married in 1947 at the St. Peter and Paul Catholic Church on North Sixth Street. They had nine children, and the family has grown to include 27

grandkids and 33 great-grandchildren, many of whom arrived for the  $100^{\rm th}$  birthday weekend. Favero's children are scattered across five states (Illinois, Missouri, Wyoming, New Mexico and Minnesota). He doesn't use a computer or have an email account or cellphone – although his wife does – and they stay in touch with phone calls and visits.

A sheet metal worker by trade, much of Favero's career was spent at Metal Air and E.L. Pruitt. When Local 218 of the International Association of Sheet Metal, Air, Rail and Transportation workers (SMART) honored him in 2021 for 80 years of membership, the union said his most memorable jobs included White Oaks Mall (opened in 1977), the attorney general's building (completed in 1983) and the Illinois Department of Transportation building (completed in 1987). Favero was a trustee for the local union for 25 years and said he never missed a day of work.

Favero said he has witnessed a lot and endured a lot, and he loves God and his country. He remains hopeful about the future. "I am optimistic for my grandkids," he said. "If they pay attention and get good grades and keep out of trouble and obey the laws, they will be fine."

Asked to elaborate about his family, he said, "I am proud of them because we have never had anyone in trouble; they were all good students, all on the honor roll and all paid for their college. They all get along. We have the greatest family in the world."  $\square$



# Setting kids up for success

Nostalgia makes for lousy public policy.

When I was in high school, my best friend's dad was outraged that the state of Illinois mandated that students be taught consumer education.

"My parents taught me how to calculate interest on a loan; why does the state need to mandate a class to teach something that basic?" said the father, who also happened to hold a doctorate in economics.

More than 40 years have passed since we had that conversation, but I can still hear the outrage in his voice. And I haven't heard a parent grumble about consumer education mandates for decades.

Today, controversy swirls around whether schools should be teaching "social and emotional education." I'll be honest, when I first heard that term, I didn't have a clue what it meant.

Often, they are called soft skills: the social and emotional tools that help students make good choices, manage their emotions, create positive relationships and collaborate.

According to National Public Radio, since 2021 there have been disputes over social-emotional learning in at least 25 states, ranging from legislation trying to remove the concept from school curriculums altogether to meetings where vehement parent rights' advocates denounced it.

It seems to have become the latest touchstone in the culture wars. I'm not quite sure why

So, I spent some time talking to the folks with Compass for Kids, a terrific organization that works in partnership with Springfield Public Schools. There are programs to help

youngsters after school and during the summer.

"Our goal is to set kids up for success in life," said Sarah Oglesby, director of programs for Compass. "So, we have dentists come in and teach them about oral health and the importance of brushing their teeth. We've had community partners come in recently from the local health department who have taught them about how germs spread and the importance of washing their hands."

I found myself asking the same question my friend's dad did 40 years ago: Why aren't parents teaching this?

Molly Berendt, executive director of Compass, explained it this way: "Just because a child is experiencing homelessness, or a child is in the foster care system, or a child is experiencing abuse or neglect – which is our population – it doesn't mean that they don't have caring, loving parents who want the very, very best for them and who are trying their best to provide everything.

"But there are kids who are experiencing neglect, and there are kids who don't know basic hygiene. ... We provide toothbrushes and toothpaste because sometimes not everybody has their own toothbrush. ... If you're not in relationship with people living in poverty, you don't necessarily know the hardships that they face."

And there is the rub.

The critics of social and emotional education usually aren't people living in poverty themselves. They are that reading-writing-and-arithmetic-only crowd who view any deviation from this mission as an apostacy.

Like it or not, with the rise of singleparent households, drug abuse and other factors, the nature of families has changed. It would seem some of those nostalgia-seekers would like to pretend that everything has stayed the same. But even having a meal together is no longer the standard for many families.

"One afternoon a week, the kids get to enjoy a family-style dinner along with the volunteers," said Berendt. "Because so many of the kids and families that we serve are food insecure when they leave Club Compass for the week, they leave with a bag of food through what's known as our 'backpack feeding program' that can help bridge those gaps when school lunch isn't available."

The most basic function of any society is

to prepare children for productive futures. And that is just the preparation youngsters are receiving through social and emotional education programs like those provided by Compass for Kids.

Further, as a society we have developed a greater understanding of challenges we face. For example, in earlier generations autism was seldom discussed. Today, autistic youngsters benefit from social and emotional education.

One of them is 13-year-old Alex Haworth, who attends Franklin Middle School in Springfield.

"I am a child with autism, so it really did benefit me to be in the program," he said.

He said he was impressed when a wildlife rescue group came and spoke to Compass.

"I found it very interesting, because I want to go into zoology. So, I like to understand how the things work with the animals."

Later this month, Compass will expand from serving strictly elementary-school children to also helping middle-school and high-school pupils.

"I am excited about that because hopefully with this new program, we can learn more about choices that have to do with college and what steps we would need to take to get these choices done," Haworth said.

It's hard to argue with that optimism.

As societal challenges evolve and our understanding of how to address them progresses, we need to embrace change.

# **STATEHOUSE FIRE**

The fire in the ground floor room on the west side of the north wing broke out in December 1886. It's mentioned in the book, *Thousand-Year Statehouse*. In contemporary news reports, it was stated that painters had supplies stored in that room, and that the fire was attributed to spontaneous combustion. Boiled linseed oil, a common painter's oil at the time, was infamous for building up heat and causing oil-soaked rags to smolder or burst into flames without warning.

There are no fireplaces on the first floor, where this fire occurred in 1886. And by fortunate coincidence, the historical paintings in the corridor had not yet been set into place (they were painted in Chicago) and thus were not affected by the smoke.

# **ETHICS ARE IMPORTANT**

We were saddened to hear about the recent closure of Memorial's Clinical Ethics Center and the disbanding of Memorial's Human Values and Ethics Committee.

More than 80% of hospitals in the country have institutional ethics committees. Memorial is now in the small minority of those without one. Memorial's interdisciplinary Human Values and Ethics Committee began in 1987, meeting monthly to review morally problematic patient cases, help develop ethics policies for the hospital and educate its members and hospital staff about health care ethics. The inclusion of community members helped ensure that a broad range of values were voiced in discussions about ethical issues arising in the hospital system. In the early years of the ethics committee, its members only occasionally conducted ethics consultations on patient cases. But requests for bedside consultations increased, and the Clinical Ethics Center was founded in 1995.

The Clinical Ethics Center ensured that, when morally troubling situations arose, highquality ethics resources were available to support decision makers, at the bedside when necessary. Experienced, highly trained, full-time ethics consultants employed at the Center began to respond to requests 24/7, mediating ethics conflicts and recommending ethically appropriate courses of action. They were in high demand, eventually conducting more than 10,000 ethics consultations at the request of Memorial nurses, physicians, social workers, patients and others. # Judge takes heat for speech

Illinois Supreme Court justice was the keynote speaker at a Democratic fundraiser **POLITICS** I Rich Miller

Among other things, sitting Illinois judges are prohibited by Illinois Supreme Court Rule 4.1 from making "speeches on behalf of a political organization," or soliciting funds for a political organization or candidate, except when they're up for election or retention.

So, you might ask, what the heck was Illinois Supreme Court Justice Elizabeth Rochford thinking when she decided to accept an invitation to be the keynote speaker at the Lake County Democratic Women annual fundraising gala on Sept. 9? The registered political action committee is one of the most influential independent county-wide campaign groups of its kind in all of Illinois, having helped recruit, train and then elect dozens of local candidates over the years (including Justice Rochford herself).

"Illinois voters deserve a fair and impartial state Supreme Court that's free of and from politics, which does not appear to be the case here," said Illinois Republican Party executive director Shaun McCabe in a press release last week about Rochford's speech.

"The Illinois Supreme Court's Code of Judicial Conduct (Canon 4, Page 48-50) is clear: sitting judges who aren't up for election shall not speak at political functions supporting the election of candidates," the Illinois Republican Party's press release claimed. A Republican Party official said later that we can expect a formal complaint will be filed soon.

The controversy boils down to two questions about the Supreme Court's rule:
1) Did Justice Rochford make a speech on behalf of a political organization? And 2) Did her role as keynote speaker mean she was soliciting funds for the Lake County Democratic Women PAC?

Rochford's defenders say "no" to both questions. She gave a non-political speech "to" a political group, not "on behalf" of it. And she didn't do anything to solicit any money for the political action committee.

Rochford herself issued a rare statement to me last week: "I receive speaking requests from many groups and organizations. I believe it is important for judges to appear in public and help educate people about the Judicial Branch. My speech at this event was about the work of the Illinois Supreme Court, its non-partisan nature and the collegiality that is fostered by our unique lodging arrangement during court terms. The content of my speech was not political in any way and so should not be construed to have been provided on behalf of any political candidate or organization."

Others who were at the event confirmed Rochford's claim that she said nothing which could be construed as partisan or campaign-related in nature.

I totally get the narrow and lawyerly interpretation. Any formal Republican complaints are likely doomed because of it. These are lawyers, after all. Words are carefully chosen for good reason.

And, more importantly, we elect our judges in Illinois, so that means we do have to accept that they are inherently political beings. If they were all appointed and confirmed by the state Senate, or whatever, it would be a different story.

But, I mean, come on.

Keynote speakers are usually invited because they help legitimize the organization and, as a result, drive increased attendance. And robust attendance is obviously very crucial to the success of any annual fundraiser.

So, while Rochford didn't technically speak "on behalf" of the group, she did help the Lake County Democratic Women further prove its bona fides by agreeing to speak.

And while she did not directly raise money for the group – which helped nominate her in a competitive Democratic primary and then elect her over a Lake County Republican general election opponent – it should have been abundantly clear that her very presence undoubtedly helped the group raise at least some campaign money that it might possibly not have brought in without her.

Rochford has been around politics for a very long time. She most certainly knows that this speech was far different from presenting to a law school symposium or bar organization.

I'm not saying that judges and justices should cloister themselves away like monks. But they should at least try to keep up appearances when they're not actively campaigning, especially during an era when every decision by just about every Supreme Court in the land, including the U.S. Supreme Court, is being analyzed for political bents. □



# Cash bail comes to an end

New pretrial systems are in place, but outcomes still uncertain

Roy Williams Jr. has seen it happen many times.

Someone is arrested and can't afford bail to get out of jail until a criminal case is resolved, whether the cost is a few hundred dollars or a few thousand.

Immediate family members who themselves are strapped for cash then try to gather money from various relatives and pool their resources. When the arrested person is released, however, Williams said many relatives don't understand why they can't get their money back right away, or even in the future, after the case is resolved and after fines, court fees and other legal costs are subtracted.

"It just causes a disruption in family relations," Williams, the Springfield City Council's Ward 3 alderperson, told *Illinois Times*. "It's a common thing in the Black community with bond."

These sorts of disruptions related to bond, also known as bail, ended Sept. 18 when Illinois became the first state in the nation to eliminate cash bail.

Thirty-two months after the Democraticcontrolled General Assembly approved the move, law enforcement and criminal justice officials in Springfield and other parts of central Illinois said they are ready to carry out the Pretrial Fairness Act but uncertain whether crime will rise or jails will house fewer defendants awaiting trial.

"I think in three months, we'll have a very good idea," Sangamon County Sheriff Jack Campbell said.

Sangamon County State's Attorney Dan Wright, a Republican, was among most state's attorneys in Illinois who joined a lawsuit that unsuccessfully challenged the constitutionality of the law.

But Wright told *Illinois Times* on Sept. 18: "All stakeholders in Sangamon County are 100% committed to making sure the new law is fairly and equitably implemented while doing everything within our power to protect the public."

Going forward, some criminal defendants – including most charged with crimes of violence such as murder and gun-related offenses – will be held in jail without bail. Others will be released without paying anything and required to comply with certain conditions and show up for court hearings.

Still others no longer will be brought to the jail and booked but given notices to appear in court. And most people charged with drug-related offenses, property crimes and theft won't even be eligible to be held in jail while their cases are adjudicated.

More than 2,000 Sangamon County

defendants each year will be affected by changes brought by the Pretrial Fairness Act, Wright estimated.

Circuit Judge Ryan Cadagin, presiding judge in Sangamon County, said the judicial system will be "prepared to fully implement the law and all its provisions."

# **Effect on public safety unclear**

Campbell, a Republican and high-profile opponent of the law and the legislative process that led to its passage, said police in the county have been trained on the law's nuances, but he remains concerned about the potential for confusion over the law's interpretation by those who enforce it.

In addition to the potential for more crime by either people who are released or those who may feel less fearful of punishment, Campbell worries morale among police officers will drop and the public will lose faith in law enforcement, especially when it comes to the way police will be restricted in responding to people trespassing on private property.

Police won't be as free to remove someone from the premises, he said.

"When you take away what we have been taught to do, our entire career is 'arrest the bad guys,' 'remove them from the scene of a crime' or 'remove them from a disturbance,'"

Campbell said. "Now we're afraid that we are going to disappoint our citizens because we will have to cite some people and walk away."

Williams, the Springfield alderperson, rejected the notion that the law will jeopardize public safety. He is a board member on Springfield's nonprofit Faith Coalition for the Common Good, one of many Illinois social-justice organizations in the Illinois Network for Pretrial Justice that have worked to eliminate bail for seven years.

"When we have change in our society, people resist it," Williams said. "They throw the bogeyman out there. ... We need to move forward"

Vanessa Knox, Faith Coalition's transformational justice chairperson, added: "For too long, our pretrial system punished people for being poor, creating generations of impacted people. Those days are over. This law will make us safer by ensuring people don't lose their jobs, homes or custody of their children because they couldn't afford to pay a money bond."

Other advocates said the law will increase public safety because it will provide judges more detailed information about defendants when deciding whether to keep people in jail. People won't be held unless there is evidence they will be a danger to someone else or the

overall community, or unless there's evidence they plan to evade prosecution.

Illinois House Speaker Emanuel "Chris" Welch, D-Hillside, said at a Sept. 18 news conference in Chicago, "Today, Illinois is no longer criminalizing poverty, and their entire nation has its eyes on us."

# The origins of the Pretrial Fairness Act

The 2021 passage of the Pretrial Fairness Act was finalized in the early-morning hours of Jan. 13, 2021, after all-night sessions of partisan debate in Springfield. It all took place while the COVID-19 pandemic was raging, many legislative hearings were held remotely, lawmakers were wearing masks and the Illinois House met in the BOS Center to promote social distancing.

The Pretrial Fairness Act was part of a broader racial-justice reform law known as the SAFE-T Act, which stands for Safety, Accountability, Fairness and Equity-Today. It was upheld by the Illinois Supreme Court two months ago.

Before, during and after the Pretrial Fairness Act's passage, there were allegations from Republicans – disputed by Democrats – that the majority party rammed the measure through the legislature without enough input from law enforcement.

The SAFE-T Act was spearheaded by the Illinois Legislative Black Caucus and gained momentum after the May 2020 suffocation death of George Floyd under the knee of a Minnesota police officer, as well as the deaths of other Black people in police custody across the country.

Advocates of the act pointed to additional evidence of what they consider unequal treatment. The U.S. Commission on Civil Rights said in a 2022 report that there was a 433% increase in the number of people detained pretrial nationwide from 1970 to 2015.

Black and Hispanic defendants have higher pretrial detention rates, and more than 60% of defendants overall are detained pretrial because they can't afford to post bail, the report said.

But opponents of the Pretrial Fairness Act said crime rates in Illinois will rise as a result of more defendants at risk of violating the law being released before trial. Supporters disagreed.

Both sides have cited conflicting studies of Cook County's judicial system, which began reducing the use of bail in 2015, and other jurisdictions in other states, to bolster their arguments.

Supporters said the statewide legislation, signed into law in February 2021 by Democratic Gov. JB Pritzker, will reduce the economic and social harm that people presumed innocent until proven guilty suffer for simply being too poor to afford bail.

State Rep. Justin Slaughter, D-Chicago,

said the Pretrial Fairness Act will help address the "mass incarceration crisis" that disproportionately affects poor, Black and Hispanic people and promotes generational poverty.

Because bail often is paid by defendants' families, Benjamin Ruddell, director of criminal justice policy for the ACLU of Illinois, said doing away with bail halts a system that "extracts wealth from communities that can least afford to pay."

# A new system goes into effect

A key part of the law, and a change from the status quo, requires hearings to be conducted within 24 or 48 hours of arrest to determine whether a person is detained or released, if the charges make that person eligible for detainment.

Anyone else would be arrested, brought to a jail and released, or would be ticketed at the scene of an incident and receive a notice to appear in court.

If state's attorneys don't have enough information to request detention, they have up to 21 days to do so.

A person arrested before the Sept. 18 effective date and subject to a previously-set cash bond may petition the court for reconsideration of their pretrial conditions under the new law and without the option of bail. The court then could end up allowing pretrial release. Depending on the charge,

petitions must be heard by the court within seven, 60 or 90 days.

Sangamon County already has had a judge in court every Sunday for bail hearings, so the county didn't have to arrange for weekend court to meet the new deadlines for detention hearings, Cadagin said.

During the week, mid-afternoon hearings will be held each weekday, if needed, when the state's attorney files requests for defendants to remain in jail.

The Sangamon County state's attorney and public defender's office have beefed up their staffs to provide judges adequate information to make a determination, Wright and Public Defender Craig Reiser said.

"Absolutely, no question – the legislation creates more work for prosecutors and defense attorneys," Wright said.

Wright said he added two paralegal positions to his staff, and Reiser said he received approval to add a paralegal to his staff.

Reiser, whose office represents the majority of people who are jailed in Sangamon County, said he is in favor of the elimination of bail.

"We start with the premise that all of our clients are innocent until proven guilty," he said. "And the decision whether an individual is detained while awaiting trial should not be determined by how much money they can post."

The Public Defender's Office may see an increase in clients. Sangamon, like some other counties in Illinois, allows private attorneys to

be guaranteed payment at the conclusion of a case from at least part of any bail posted. The money is an incentive to lawyers in private practice.

Without bail, however, fewer defense lawyers may be willing to represent otherwise indigent defendants, Reiser said.

"I anticipate we may get additional cases, but we don't know," he said.

# More expenses, less revenue

In total, the SAFE-T Act will cost Sangamon County about \$1 million more annually, according to Sangamon County Administrator Brian McFadden. Of the total, \$270,000 will be spent to fully equip all sheriffs deputies with body cameras.

New personnel for the State's Attorney's and Public Defender's Office will cost about \$390,000 per year, and the elimination of bail will mean an estimated loss of \$300,000 annually for the sheriff's department and circuit clerk's office, McFadden said.

The sheriff's department has an annual budget of \$23 million, and county government as a whole operates with a \$129 million to \$160 million annual budget, he said.

Property taxes won't rise, and services won't be cut in other areas, to afford the additional net expenses, McFadden said. The county has worked to become more efficient, and there are plans to install an electronic case management system for the State's Attorney's

Office as part of the effort, he said.

Some of the additional costs could be offset by funding from the state for the Public Defender's Office and for body cameras. The legislature has set aside funding for those purposes, including \$10 million for public defenders statewide, though McFadden said the funding either has been delayed or not yet disbursed.

Many Sangamon County officials suspect that the jail population – which currently hovers around 300 – will drop as a result of the new law. But no one knows for sure it will, and if so, by how much.

The average population would have to drop by 50 to 75 inmates for the county to realize any cost savings on jail personnel, food and related expenses, McFadden said.

Sangamon County's court services office may end up monitoring more defendants who are released rather than jailed, but Kent Holsopple, the office's director, said there are no plans to increase staff.

Many less-populous counties never before offered pretrial services but will receive them through a new Office of Statewide Pretrial Services that was created by the Illinois Supreme Court.

# "It's not Armageddon"

The Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts plans to monitor caseloads and other aspects of the Pretrial Fairness Act for positive and negative effects. That monitoring will include the impact of new requirements for people facing misdemeanor and felony charges related to alleged domestic violence, according to Christine Raffaele, director of policy and systems advocacy for the Illinois Coalition Against Domestic Violence.

The coalition supported the law's passage because it helps ensure the most dangerous defendants will be held in jail pretrial. The law, Raffaele said, calls for "more robust hearings" and makes the safety of victims paramount in a judge's decision-making process on release.

The law also provides greater assurance that alleged perpetrators who violate an order of protection will be arrested and jailed until a hearing can be held, she said.

The bail that used to be set for domestic violence defendants "never made anybody safe," she said.

Sheriff Campbell, however, said he believes neighborhoods will be less safe, especially when it comes to people trespassing and disrupting the peace.

Several pieces of follow-up legislation, known as trailer bills, were passed to clarify or modify the new law. Included was a section that allows police to arrest and bring a person to jail if he or she is trespassing and refuses to leave or produce identification. The original legislation didn't allow for arrest.

But other people who would have been arrested and removed from the scene in the past now will be given a citation and could return later, prompting another call to police, Campbell said.

And people arrested for retail theft no longer are eligible for detainment. They could return to the scene of the crime after being booked, fingerprinted and released, Campbell said.

"We're afraid people will think we're not doing our job, which then can impact the morale of our deputies," he said.

People arrested for burglary of a business also aren't eligible to be jailed pretrial, Campbell said.

"My experience is the drug trade is tied to all these thefts and burglaries," he said. "They're stealing anything of value that can be pawned or traded for drugs. They're going to go out and continue to commit these thefts and burglaries to feed their drug habit."

In response to complaints, the General Assembly, in one of the trailer bills, made it easier for prosecutors to ask judges to detain people charged with certain crimes if the defendants pose "a real and present threat to the safety of any person or persons in the community." Those crimes include robbery, residential burglary and kidnapping.

Under the original legislation, people charged with these crimes qualified for detention only if prosecutors could meet the high bar of proving "a high likelihood of willful flight." After legislative tweaks, the law now lists willful flight as one of several risk factors prosecutors can pick from when arguing that defendants should remain in jail

while awaiting trial.

Campbell said he surveyed the background of 20 random inmates in the jail in August 2022 and found that the average number of arrests among those inmates was 26. He didn't count the number of convictions.

The sheriff said proponents of the Pretrial Fairness Act portray most jails as a "pauper's prison ... and that these are just good people that made a mistake and they should not be held in jail." But Campbell said most people in the jail have been convicted of serious violent felonies in the past.

"This tells me that when they are not locked up, they commit crimes," he said. "This is what they do for a living. If they weren't in our jail, they're not going to get up and go to work the next day. So I'm concerned about public safety in our community."

Campbell acknowledged the inherent unfairness of bail for low-income people. But he faulted supporters of the Pretrial Fairness Act for not seriously considering adopting a system similar to the federal courts, which also doesn't allow for bail – only detainment or release pretrial – and requires even more hearings in front of judges.

He also acknowledged that such a switch, which no state has made, would be more expensive than even the new system that went into effect Sept. 18.

Morgan County State's Attorney Gray Noll said he has concerns that people at risk of future crimes may be released and commit more crimes if he doesn't have information soon after an arrest, or up to 21 days later, to use in a petition for detainment.

But he said: "It's not Armageddon. There's

not going to be an influx of horrible people being released."

His bigger concern is that people who were arrested for methamphetamine possession in the past and held in jail because they couldn't afford bail no longer qualify for detention pretrial.

Time in jail allowed many of them to go through detoxification behind bars, Noll said. That experience motivated many of them to get into treatment later, he said. Now, he suspects many will continue using and suffer fatal overdoses with drugs often laced with the powerful opioid fentanyl.

However, Rachel King-Johnson, director of clinical outreach for Phoenix Center, said pretrial incarceration diminishes a defendant's tolerance for illegal drugs and puts people at "a significant risk for drug overdose following release from incarceration."

Elimination of cash bail "ensures continuity of care for folks utilizing drug treatment programs, medication-assisted treatments such as methadone and suboxone, harm reduction and recovery services," she said.

Christian County State's Attorney John McWard said he is not in favor of many parts of the law and doesn't like the fact that spitting in the face of a police officer – which can be charged as aggravated battery – doesn't qualify a defendant for detainment in most cases unless there is "great bodily harm."

Defendants in mostly rural Christian County also aren't eligible to be detained if they allegedly break into a farm shed and steal property, McWard said.

"What I am concerned about is the public's trust in the judicial system prosecuting crimes," he said. "I'm concerned that people may have distrust for what we're trying to do."

Christopher Reif, chief judge of the Seventh Judicial Circuit, which includes Sangamon County, and presiding judge in Morgan County, said the new law will create scheduling challenges for rural counties in which judges juggle criminal cases in multiple counties.

"We just don't know the effect long term," he said. "Talk to me in three or six months."

The law may result in a backlog of civil cases because the criminal cases will take precedence, Reif said.

When asked whether the law could result in him releasing someone pretrial who then commits more crimes, Reif said: "I had these same concerns in the prior system. . . . It's going to put more burdens on prosecutors and defense attorneys. These people are already overworked and busy."

# **Campfire cooking**

Plan ahead, prep at home, enjoy **FOOD | Ashley Meyer** 

I'm not sure why I love camping so much. It's quite an effort, especially when kids are involved. Yet each year when the frenetic pace of summer relaxes into the steady amble of autumn, I simply cannot wait to make the lists and haul out the gear and prep the food and get outside for the weekend. At some point I'll wonder why I'm doing all of this and grumble that it takes a lot of work to recreate, but once we're set up, the magic of the woods takes over and it all seems worth it.

While the magic is real, so is the preparation and planning required to cast its spell. My camp cooking has shifted over the years from luxe grilled salmon for two to more family-friendly and budget-friendly meals that require little more than pulling packets out of the cooler and heating them on the grill. This method involves a lot of foil and some work on the front end, but the result is worth it. Beyond camping, this foil-wrapped kind of meal prep is useful at home too, whether you're getting a jump on the week ahead or entertaining guests.

Use heavy-duty foil when preparing these recipes; regular foil will tear too easily. All these recipes should be cooked over a medium fire, which can be gauged by holding your hand about five inches over the grill grate (about the height of a soda can). If you pull your hand away in two to four seconds, the heat is high; if you can hold your hand for five to seven seconds, the heat is medium.

# **Campfire French toast**

3 cups day-old French bread, cut into cubes 4 eggs

½ cup half and half

1/4 cup maple syrup (plus more for serving)

½ teaspoon cinnamon

A pinch of salt

2 tablespoons butter

½ cup berries or chopped nuts, optional

At home, place the cubed bread in a gallon zip-top bag.

Combine the eggs, milk, syrup, cinnamon and salt and mix well. Transfer to a pint jar to pack in the cooler. (This mixture can be frozen.)

At the campsite, add the egg mixture to the bread cubes in the bag, mix gently and set aside for a few minutes. Roll out a piece of aluminum foil about 16 inches long and spread it with one tablespoon of the butter, leaving a one-inch border around the edge of the foil. Repeat this with a second piece.

Dump the bread mixture onto the first piece of foil and spread it over the buttered



area. Place the second piece of foil buttered side down over the bread mixture and crimp the edges to seal. Place the packet over a medium fire and cook for 8 to 10 minutes, flipping once and cooking another 8 minutes. Let cool for 5 minutes before carefully opening.

# Make-ahead breakfast sandwiches

10 eggs
3/4 cup half and half
Salt and pepper to taste
2 tablespoons melted butter
6 English muffins
6 slices bacon or ham (optional)
6 slices cheese, preferably American

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees and lightly spray a 9x13 glass baking dish with cooking spray. Beat together the eggs and cream and add a pinch of salt and black pepper to taste. Bake the eggs in a preheated oven for about 30 minutes until the eggs are slightly puffed and barely jiggly. Set aside to cool.

While the eggs are baking, brush each half of the English muffins with melted butter and place on a baking sheet. When the eggs come out of the oven, raise the oven heat to 375 degrees. Transfer the muffins to the oven and bake until lightly toasted. Remove from the

oven and let cool.

Use a biscuit cutter or glass to cut six rounds of egg. Line up the muffin bottoms and place half a slice of cheese, a circle of egg, a slice of bacon or ham, if using, and another half slice of cheese on each before placing on the buttered tops. Wrap each sandwich in a square of heavyduty foil. Refrigerate for up to 3 days or freeze in a zip-top bag and store up to one month.

The sandwiches can be reheated in the microwave from frozen (remove the foil and wrap in a paper towel) on full power for about one minute. To reheat in an oven or campfire, allow sandwiches to thaw first before baking in a 375-degree oven for 8 to 10 minutes, or by placing over a medium campfire for about three to four minutes per side.

# Campfire shrimp and sausage jambalaya

8 ounces andouille or smoked sausage, sliced into half moons

 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup each chopped onion and green bell pepper

3 cloves minced garlic

3 cups cooked brown rice, cold

1 14.5-ounce can fire-roasted tomatoes

½ teaspoon each granulated onion and garlic 1 teaspoon each dried Italian herb blend and paprika

Salt, black pepper and cayenne to taste 1 pound small raw shrimp, peeled and deveined Soft butter, for greasing foil

At home, sauté the sausage in a skillet over medium-high heat until lightly browned, then transfer to a mixing bowl. Add the diced vegetables and garlic and sauté until fragrant and slightly softened, then add to the sausage in the mixing bowl. Set aside and allow to come to room temperature. When cool, add the cold cooked rice, tomatoes and seasonings. Taste and adjust salt and pepper as needed. Add the shrimp and mix well.

Butter the middle of a 12-inch by 18-inch piece of heavy-duty foil, leaving a 2-inch border around the edge. Place a quarter of the rice in the center of the foil then bring up the sides and double-fold the top and ends to create a packet, making sure to leave some room for heat to circulate. Place in a zip-top bag for secure storage in the ice chest and cook within 1-2 days.

Place on a medium-hot campfire and cook for 5-6 minutes per side, turning once, until the shrimp are cooked through. If you open it and the shrimp are not yet pink, rewrap the packet and return to the grill for a few minutes more.



The Suns definitely have Mike, John and "Cowboy" Bob playing, plus Joe Dawkins as well. I'm not sure who else, but for sure there will be some "whatever else happens" as mentioned for Friday. Thanks for coming to town, John, and stirring up the pot.

It's time once again for the Chatham Pawsa-Palooza and Kite Up the Park, an event of two fests at once, both about "raising money for the ongoing maintenance and improvements to the Chatham Community Dog Park" and produced by bassist extraordinaire and a fine friend to dogs everywhere, Jeff Cunningham. Along with the canines and kites experience, you better believe there will be live music as Solar Chariot (12-1 p.m.) and Mary Jo Curry (3:45-4:45) provide the tune time fun in the sun.

Don't forget, (and it's hard to miss) this weekend Springfield hosts the International Route 66 Mother Road Festival (congrats to Coop and Shaner). For some more festive fun, head down south to Palmyra this Sunday to Vixen Hill Winery and the 6th Annual Cigar Box Guitar Festival. Hosted by Logan's Homegrown CBGs, the music kicks off at noon and features Cody and the Chameleons, plus special guests.

Go have some fun and see you next week. □






