Every year, we ask our opinionated readers to tell us about their favorite people, places and things in the Springfield area. Over the decades we've been doing this, we've continued to tweak both the process and the results issue to try to keep things fresh and interesting, and of course, the votes tend to reflect current trends. In 2020, all 10 of the most popular categories were foodrelated, perhaps because there wasn't much else to do. Now, our readers are back to showing their cultured side, with places to see a play or musical, museum and Abraham Lincoln historic site joining perpetually popular categories such as best doughnut, burger and horseshoe. We also add and subtract categories every year based on participation levels and reader feedback. Wondering how all this works? Here are the answers to the most common questions we hear:

## Q. Are the results real? Don't you just pick your advertisers to win?

A. The Best of Springfield results are based on what our readers chose as the best, which is not always the same as what our staff would prefer. Just ask the advertising department, there are many winners who have never spent a dime with us and others who frequently advertise but failed to win their category. While advertising helps remind people to vote for you, it certainly doesn't guarantee the outcome.

#### Q. Why did national companies or chain stores win some of the categories? If you're a locally owned business, shouldn't you support other locally owned businesses?

A. See previous answer. We encourage our readers to vote (and shop) local, but ultimately, we don't control the votes.

**Q. Why wasn't \_\_\_\_\_ category included?**A. There are already more than 200 categories,

so from a logistical perspective we have to consider the attention span of both the voters and readers. However, we do add and subtract categories based on reader interest and current events (we recently added categories for comedian and podcast in response to reader requests and online-only boutique is a new category this year). Keep in mind that there needs to be at least four or five contenders in a category to make it competitive, so if you're asking for "Best battery store," "Best place to buy a musical instrument," or "Best auctioneer" (all actual requests we've had), we're taking that into consideration. If you think of a great category we've missed, email our associate publisher, James Bengfort, at jbengfort@illinoistimes.com.

## Q. Why wasn't \_\_\_\_\_ one of the options when I voted?

A. We hold an initial nomination round beginning in mid-August. The top five votegetters in each category move on to the final voting. So if you want to lobby for a particular person or business to win, the time to start is in the nomination round.

## Q. Why don't all of the winners have a write up this year?

A. We used to publish a short blurb on each of the top picks. However, we do have many repeat winners, and it can be hard to find something different to say each year. Starting in 2019, we switched to a format with longer (but fewer) profiles. We now try to highlight new winners and categories to make it more interesting and informative for the reader.

# **Springfield Lucky Horseshoes**

In just their first year of existence, the Springfield Lucky Horseshoes baseball team made it to the playoffs and were voted the best local sports team by *Illinois Times* readers.

"We had a very exciting inaugural season, for sure," said Jamie Toole, who leads the team with his wife, Melissa Gaynor. "It was pretty good. We actually made the playoffs."

The team he leads may be the first one in the history of American sports named after an open-faced sandwich.

They received hundreds of suggestions for what to name the team that they and several other investors acquired earlier this year. But they settled on naming it after a uniquely Springfield cuisine.

Average game attendance has been 1,300 this year.

"We have a lot of sponsors and a lot of ticket buyers and groups," Toole said. "I think next season will be - I don't want to say easier - but a little less challenging, because this time we won't be coming to a new community and not really know anyone. The ballpark is a big ballpark - 5,000 seats. Our goal is to significantly grow in 2023, and we're off to a great start with our season ticket renewals already."

The team has also profited from Lucky Horseshoe-branded merchandise.

"We sold merchandise all over the country – all 50 states. We've been really, really pleased with our merchandise sales," he said.

The Horseshoes are part of the Prospect League, a summer collegiate wood bat baseball league for players with college eligibility. The league considers providing family-friendly, affordable baseball entertainment in the communities where its teams are located as one of its important purposes, and the Horseshoes' 30-game season featured many promotion nights, including fireworks and live entertainment.

The new owners are also focused on making improvements to Robin Roberts Stadium, where the team plays, next to Lanphier High School. The scoreboard located at the left-center field wall has been modernized, and a new beer garden along the right field line features beer from local craft brewers including a homegrown product, Lucky Lager. Work is also underway on an indoor Stadium Club that will be located in the team offices and will allow for private parties, press announcements and other non-baseball events, and a new, all-weather playing field is in the long-range plan.



# Cam Lecocq Matilda

This was one of those performances that spoke to the adage "good things come in small packages." In the Springfield Muni Opera's *Matilda*, Cam Lecocq mastered the role Matilda Wormwood with aplomb. They easily embodied and conveyed the character's complexities through a well-done accent, strong singing and capable acting. The mix of sadness, wonderment and a little bit of naughtiness impressed and entertained audiences night after night. It's no surprise that this memorable performance was chosen for a Best of Springfield nod.

*Matilda* was part of the Muni's first season back post-pandemic, and this enchantingly odd show was a welcome feast for the senses, with artful designs, witty dialog and a talented cast, with Lecocq leading the charge. Matilda is a demanding role, requiring the performer to almost never leave the stage, but Lecocq made it look easy. It was their first, but definitely not last, lead role and we look forward to future performances.

Speaking of which, Lecocq can be seen next in Springfield Theatre Centre's *Fun Home*, which opens Nov. 11 at the Hoogland Center for the Arts. Lecocq is also proof the apple doesn't fall far from the tree as real-life dad, Scott, portrayed their father in *Matilda* and has been seen in other local productions, while mom Kristi is a well-known singer fronting popular area bands. # Mike Wallace Ragtime, the Musical

Also part of the Muni Opera's first season back after being dark for two years, *Ragtime, the Musical* was a timely and relevant show which tackled themes of wealth disparity and discrimination. Michael Wallace as Coalhouse Walker, Jr. was an effortless and passionate powerhouse, portraying a proud man making his way at the turn of the century with his family. He radiated warmth and confidence through his strong, steady performance, even while having to navigate some last-minute changes within the production. Audiences truly felt his pain as they witnessed his character suffer injustice at the hands of others and, after experiencing a crushing loss, decide that his only recourse is to resort to violence. Wallace gave a thoughtful performance in a moving production.

He has performed in other historical shows including *Civil War* at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum, and he made his Muni debut in *Big River* in 2004. He's also an accomplished blues singer who, with his fellow musicians. have traveled all over entering (and sometimes winning) blues competitions and recording music. His lifelong gift and love of singing and music made his performance a clear standout for Best Of Springfield voters. If you ever get the chance to see him perform, don't let it pass you by!



# **Broadgauge**

Although it recently went through a change in kitchen staff, that doesn't seem to have made a difference to our readers, who voted Broadgauge as the best new restaurant and the best overall restaurant - this despite being in Petersburg, a decent drive from Springfield.

Owner Douglas Pope left Petersburg to attend college more than 20 years ago and returned during the pandemic, now able to work remotely. "I made a really quick decision, within a week of moving back, that the Broadgauge would be my new passion and what I want to give back to the Petersburg community," he told IT last year when work was getting underway. He acquired the 1872-vintage Broadgauge building, formerly Robbins Department Store, along with several nearby properties and set about transforming the northwest corner of the town square.

First-time diners can't help but note that the physical space itself is stunning. There's plenty of dark wood, yet Broadgauge still seems light and airy. Check out the grand staircase that leads to the open second floor, or have a seat at the long bar. In addition to the public areas, there are numerous other unique spaces that can host all

The food equals, if not surpasses, the setting. Broadgauge offers a delightful combination of drinks with some interesting twists and a well-rounded but compact menu that has something for just about everyone. Dishes like cheese curds (served with a unique yum-yum sauce), the 1872 beef filet, the fried chicken and pan-seared halibut keep customers coming back. Our personal favorite is the Jimmysticks hot chicken made with buttermilk tenders, hot honey glaze and pimento cheese.

For those not in the mood for a full dinner, Broadgauge offers brunch and lunch and also has a coffee shop, bakery and performing arts and events center. Finally, Broadgauge is quite popular, so reservations are highly recommended.

# **Old Luxemburg Inn**

The Old Lux, as the Old Luxemburg Inn is commonly known, is a Springfield icon. It's located on the east side in a building that's over 100 years old and decked out with wood paneling that gives it a supper-club feeling. And, the bar still offers the grasshopper – a drink that most bartenders no longer know how to serve. The place just oozes retro ambiance. And don't forget about the delicious fried lobster tails.

But this year, the Old Lux won recognition for having Springfield's best steaks.

We love that the place advertises that they aren't responsible for steaks cooked more than medium and that there are only six steaks to choose from – the filet, ribeye, strip, sirloin, chopped sirloin or T-bone. All dishes come with a choice of potato (the loaded potato being the crowd favorite) and sides include classics like sauteed mushrooms and an Escoffier sauce. In our eyes, the only thing missing is the escargot.

Readers also like the chivecheese sauce (delicious on a baked potato) and the homemade house salad dressing. But the steaks really stand out – all are well-sized, tender, with appropriate marbling and great flavor. Note that the Old Lux only seasons steaks upon request – we think they're a little bland without the Old Lux's proprietary spice rub, so be sure to ask for it.

# **Springfield Police Department Neighborhood Police Officers**

Garnering more votes than any of the area's high-profile elected officials are our Neighborhood Police Officers (NPOs), showing how much Springfield values this service of our police department.

Currently there are five NPOs: Officer Taylor Sullivan, Officer Timara Pflug, Officer Ryan Binkley, Officer Cody Musson and Officer Andy Watts. Officer Krystal Holdman was also an NPO until March of 2022, leaving to take a position with the Illinois State Police.

Sgt. Matt Doss, who has supervised the NPOs for two-and-a-half years, was previously an NPO himself for the Enos Park and Pillsbury neighborhoods. He insists that the current NPOs deserve the spotlight as they do the work, and his role is to make sure they have what they need.

NPOs are seen in neighborhood association meetings and events like Neighborhood Night Out and Coffee With a Cop. They show up at schools and community centers such as the Northside Children's Community Library in Enos Park, where they recently spent the afternoon reading books, playing games and painting with neighborhood children.

In their position as a liaison between neighborhoods and the Police Department, Doss says, "We try to address long-term problems in a neighborhood, whether it is disputes, traffic complaints or nuisance properties with loud music or suspicious activities." Doss says NPOs work with other agencies like the Illinois Department of Public Health or state or federal law enforcement agencies to resolve problems. This gives them the opportunity to address issues that are outside what a regular patrol officer has time to work on before being dispatched to another call.

There are eight beats in Springfield and currently only five officers working those beats. Doss says that police officers continued to retire during the pandemic, but no training academies were producing new officers, so their ranks have thinned. The Springfield Police Department is working to fill several positions, and then all eight beats will have a dedicated NPO.

In an era of somewhat frequent tension between police and citizens, Springfield is blessed to have a team of personable NPOs to help improve the quality of life in our neighborhoods and present to our children the face of a police force that is here to serve and protect.

#### **UNSUNG HERO**

# **Charlene Powers**

This unsung hero has courage, conscientiousness, perseverance, resilience and passion. Charlene Powers, a volunteer board member of WILD Canine Rescue, was raised with grit and inspired by her father, who was a commercial trapper. Powers said her dad would take her along when he was trapping, and he taught her how to think outside the box, or outfox the fox, because the fox is the trickiest animal to trap. He inspired her to do what she does – rescue dogs each and every day.

Powers begins each morning by checking two Facebook pages, Sangamon County Lost Pets and Central Illinois Lost Pets. Powers said, "I usually get tagged after a dog has been missing for a couple of days." This is when she reaches out to the owners to offer suggestions as to how they might track their lost dog, and she offers her help. Powers said it's imperative to have people looking out for lost dogs and reporting those sightings, because dogs will create a pattern of activity and that's how she knows where to set the traps. Not all dogs are lost from a home, however. She rescues dogs that are feral, those that are lost due to being in a car that was involved in an accident and rescues from puppy mills.

Powers said, "I'm relentless once I get on task; there's nothing more important to me than getting an animal safe. I've spent many nights in my truck during cold weather watching the traps so that a dog won't freeze. It's the most gratifying feeling to pull up in someone's driveway and give them their animal. I imagine it might be like what it feels like for a doctor to deliver a baby and hand it to its mother. The longest I've ever looked for one dog was 23 days. I spent over 200 hours looking for that dog, and I found it."

Although Powers' dad passed away 19 years ago, he's present in her daily life. Before she sets out traps to track lost dogs, she says a prayer that her dad guides her and that God helps her find the lost dogs and bring them home safely.

Powers has been with WILD for three years and is involved in every aspect of dog rescue from start to finish. In addition to her full-time passion of rescuing dogs, she will be retiring from the state of Illinois at the end of 2022. She said she wishes she would have found her calling earlier in life, but after recovering from having both knees replaced, she'll be ready to get back at it.

# Liz Rupel

When Liz Rupel saw that she had been nominated, she was touched that someone was thinking of her. "It's just like a motivator when you needed one," she says. "There's someone out there in the community that believes in you. It's a motivator to keep making change and trying to make this world a little better."

Rupel has been the lead organizer with the Illinois Stewardship Alliance (ISA) since 2018, working to change local food systems for the better. Her work involves going out and meeting farmers where they are to discuss barriers they face, then coming back to her team and figuring out if there is a policy change that can dismantle that barrier.

One of her crowning achievements in the last few years was being part of the effort of several organizations that were instrumental in getting the Industrial Hemp Act passed in Illinois, legalizing hemp for fiber and CBD. Ashland farmer Chad Wallace of Oak Tree Organics told her: "I feel like I'm changing lives when someone tells me they no longer have pain," because of the CBD hemp he grows.

Illinois is an agricultural state, and it's only natural that people take an interest in their food. "One good thing about the pandemic," remarks Rupel, "people did stop and take a look at where their food comes from and who grew it. It's great looking at food and regenerative agriculture. Before they seemed like separate little islands, but the word is getting out that everything is connected. It starts with soil."

As for 2023, Rupel says they have some "cool things in store for climate and water quality." With climate change transitioning from a hypothetical future to our everyday reality, the connections between our food and how it is grown and the health of the planet we are passing on to future generations is even more apparent.

With ISA, Rupel notes, "I'm there as an organizer to make sure that I'm helping to build up other leaders and encouraging our farmer members that they can take action, and to help give the tools that others need to be leaders themselves. I'm laying the groundwork for others, but also trying to be part of the change the best I can. I want to see other people shine."



#### **BUDTENDER**

# **Samuel Brubaker, Prairie State Hemp**

Samuel Brubaker, owner, founder and head budtender at Prairie State Hemp, 460 E. Washington St., has over 10 years' experience in the cultivation and wholesale supply of cannabis, but is fairly new to the budtender aspect of the business. However, when he opened Prairie State Hemp in April 2022 and had not yet found a budtender to serve customers, he quickly got up to speed and made it happen. Brubaker can now add outstanding budtender to his resume.

The term budtender was first used in 1997, following the 1996 legalization of medical marijuana in the state of California – the very first state in the country to legalize. A budtender is an integral position to the entire dispensary operation. It is the most visible position in cannabis retail and is at the heart of customer service. Each person who walks into a dispensary has a unique reason for visiting, numerous questions to be answered, and they may be there for recreational or medicinal use.

Brubaker said that as a budtender he gets great satisfaction from helping people, especially "when you can increase the quality of someone's life." He said the business side of the dispensary is fun, but his passion is "being able to help people find something that will benefit them, whether it be medicinal or for recreational use."

A competent budtender needs to have a great deal of knowledge. Brubaker said, "We create many of these products in-house. I know what's in there and how it can interact with someone's medications or mental state." Being a budtender, he continued, "is not just about selling the products."

Brubaker said, "We place a big emphasis on local. All products are locally sourced, and the CBD products are grown in Illinois." Brubaker himself grew up in Taylorville.

Plans for the future, according to Brubaker, include continuing his education within the industry, diversifying the product line and bringing new products to customers. As the business hires new budtenders, Brubaker said he will educate them so there's no gap in skills. "We are building a good team of budtenders at Prairie State Hemp."

## **Aviatori Coffeehouse**

What happens when you mix a love of aviation and coffee? Aviatori Coffeehouse, the best new business in downtown and runner-up for best coffeehouse in Springfield.

Settling down in Havana, Illinois, after falling in love with the area while working as crop dusters, Juliana Turchetti and Joe Coppick decided to take their passion for coffee to the next level, planning to open a coffee house in Havana. But after running the numbers, Turchetti says that they were not sure Havana could support a second coffeehouse. That led them to broaden their search to Springfield, which led to a historic home across from the Willard Ice Building.

"I was in love with this building as soon as I opened the door," recounted Turchetti, who felt a connection with the home's previous owner, Tony Leone, who died in 2021 before fulfilling his vision of opening a café in the space. "He has Italian roots just like me. He had a dream of opening a cafe here. It's a lot of happy coincidences, and Aviatori is a great way to make both our dreams come true."

Coffee is sourced from family farms in Brazil where Turchetti grew up, and roasted locally in Havana. Patrons can also pick up bulk beans and pre-ground coffee for enjoyment at home or work. It's not just the great-tasting coffee that attracts customers, though.

"We get a lot of compliments," recounts Turchetti, "people who come here and tell us they love the atmosphere, the ambiance. It's quiet. People spend two or three hours here, sitting down with their feet up, reading a book. I was looking for cozy comfort with some style, and I was lucky enough to find a lot of nice pieces of furniture."

In addition to coffee, Aviatori also offers teas, Italian sodas, desserts, muffins and biscuits, and Pão de Queijo, a gluten-free, traditional Brazilian cheese roll made inhouse. The coffeehouse can be rented for private parties and special events. Turchetti hopes to install new signage soon to increase awareness of their business.

Turchetti says that being selected as the Best of Springfield "is a great surprise, because we've been open only five months. I feel honored and supported by the community."

## **ONLINE BOUTIQUE**

## **Piper + Arrows Boutique**

The name Piper + Arrows Boutique, winner of the 2022 Best of Springfield poll of *Illinois Times* readers for online boutique, was inspired by the 127th chapter of Psalms.

In that book of the Bible, children are described as "arrows in the hands of a warrior" and a blessing to parents "whose quiver is full of them."

Jocelyn Piper, 38, said she started Piper + Arrows five years ago to help her and her husband, Troy Piper, 54, afford additional costs associated with adopting and caring for children from Hong Kong who have physical and developmental disabilities.

That cause has helped the women's clothing business grow and sustain its base of customers, she said.

"People like our story and the convenience of shopping online," said Piper, a Chatham resident.

She works a full-time job out of her home as a corporate negotiator for Blue

Cross and Blue Shield of Illinois, and her husband is a physical education teacher at Rochester High School and Junior High.

They have a blended family with three biological children from previous marriages and have also adopted three children. Their first adopted child, Nolan, died from medical complications of his seizure disorder in May 2021 at age 9. Their second adopted son, Francis, joined the family in 2018 and is 14. Proceedings for the adoption of their third child, daughter Oaklynn, 7, were completed in August.

Jocelyn Piper said starting the online boutique seemed to be a "creative way" to fund the adoption of their second child. "It has been a way of helping keep us afloat," she said.

"I've always loved fashion and wanted to go to school to become a fashion designer," she said. That dream fell by the wayside, however, when Piper attended college on a softball scholarship at a school where fashion design wasn't offered as a degree.

In her business, which primarily operates on Facebook and Instagram, she said she works with various wholesalers and an outside shipper.

"It's quality items where I've vetted the vendors," she said.

Piper operated a brick-and-mortar store in downtown Springfield from June 2021 to June 2022, but had to close down after she was hospitalized this summer because of complications from Type 1 diabetes.

She said the complications resulted from the loss of her longtime Springfield Clinic doctor when the clinic became an out-of-network provider to Blue Cross members in 2021.

Piper said she encountered delays in getting in to see a new in-network provider from SIU Medicine and wasn't able to replace her insulin pump on a timely basis.

She said she has since been able to establish medical care at SIU and get a new insulin pump, but the ordeal took a toll on her health. She abandoned the downtown store and restarted the online business, which had been on hold.

Piper said she and her husband, who attend Hope Church in Springfield, don't plan to adopt more children. But she said they are happy that they have been able to provide a loving home for children with special needs and show how these children can be blessings to their adoptive parents and others they touch.

"There are so many children around the world who are discarded because they have special needs," she said. "They are the brightest part of our day."

### BUSINESS GIVING BACK TO THE COMMUNITY COOKIE

### Café Moxo

Readers recognized Café Moxo as the business that does the best to give back to the community.

That's not an accident; owner Mark Forinash founded the business 15 years ago with community service in mind.

"Being downtown, you get to know so many of the population that live on the streets because you spend a lot of time with them," he said. "And as opposed to battling them and complaining and judging, we probably should just bring them into our community in hopes that they get the opportunity to get off the streets."

During the peak of COVID, Café Moxo routinely gave away meals to those in need, which included direct giveaways as well as partnering with area churches and the Salvation Army. And all of this took place despite the damage caused by the pandemic to Café Moxo and so many of its fellow dining establishments. In fact, on just one day during the pandemic, Café Moxo handed out more than 500 meals to those in need.

But even before the pandemic Café Moxo was community oriented, holding events like Giving Tuesdays where proceeds from the sale of certain items were donated to various charities. In the eyes of the owners, it was about "giving back to the community that's given so much back to us."

Café Moxo also takes care of its community of employees – which is just as important as giving to the community as a whole. Going back to 2009, employees have been paid at least \$15 per hour. (As a frame of reference, Illinois' minimum wage doesn't reach \$15 per hour until Jan. 1, 2025. It is currently at \$12.) Café Moxo also makes sure that its employees enjoy an acceptable work-life balance to minimize burnout and turnover. For example, when Café Moxo was open all weekend, no employee ever worked both days. Keep up the good work, Moxo.



Brown, 30, said she takes care to communicate thoroughly with customers to make sure they understand what grooming services their dogs will receive and what the grooming involves.


Dog owners want to make sure their dogs are safe and won't go through emotional trauma, and communication helps to ease any worries they may have, she

Business has been far from dead for Staab Funeral Homes.

The four-generation firm has been voted Springfield's best funeral home by *Illinois Times* readers.

P.J. Staab, president of Staab Funeral Homes, says the key to their success is their commitment to serving grieving families.

The business began in 1927 when George Staab, a union plumber, went into partnership with John O'Donnell to create the O'Donnell & Staab Funeral Home and Ambulance Service. A decade later, Staab and his wife, Christine, founded Staab Funeral Home at its current location in a Victorian home near Fifth and Allen streets. The building has been added onto and enhanced many times since.

In 2017, the funeral home opened a second location in Sherman.

"I've not reached my first big success yet," P.J. Staab said. "I anticipate that the first big success, from a very humble perspective, would be that when I'm out of the picture this business will be transitioned to the fourth generation with the same level of wisdom that our founders transitioned to the second and third generations. ... That's the biggest challenge."

The firm serves about 400 families each year after the death of a loved one. It also provides preplanning and pet cremation services.

Over the years, Staab Funeral Homes has handled some unusual requests. One person's wish was to be buried in his sports car. When he died, he was interred sitting in his MG Midget, surrounded by a concrete burial vault.

Others have had more pedestrian wishes, such as being buried in a barnboard casket or having the funeral procession loop through favorite spots such as Washington Park or the Illinois State Fairgrounds.

"Right now, we are the oldest continually operated family-owned funeral home in this market. And we are proud of that," Staab said.





## **Once in a Blue Moon International Gift Gallery**

"Janet, you need to think about what you're going to do when all of this is behind you. What brings you joy?"

Balding, puffy and in the middle of chemotherapy, Janet Barkmeier, owner of Once in a Blue Moon, hadn't given much thought as to what came next. But the words of her nurse practitioner came back to her throughout chemo as she asked herself: What brings me joy?

Barkmeier operated the original Once in a Blue Moon in Springfield from 1995-1998, closing the business to devote herself full-time to her children. "When I closed that shop in '98, I wasn't done with it. I closed it, but I didn't sell it," says Barkmeier.

Revisiting the idea in 2017 after recovering from chemo and cleared of cancer, Barkmeier's kids were grown. And when thinking about what really brought her joy, reopening Once in a Blue Moon was the answer.

The store at 1535 Wabash Ave. opened in 2018, and is filled with handmade, artisan and fair-trade items. The term "fair trade" means goods have been certified to meet criteria assuring that living wages are paid to the makers of the goods and there is no exploitation.

Barkmeier says art is the umbrella term for what her shop offers. Among the goods at Barkmeier's shop are Polish pottery, clothing, hats, purses, greeting cards, holiday and seasonal decorations, baskets, sun-catchers, paintings, extensive beadwork and Firefly jewelry.

A former English teacher, Barkmeier attaches story cards to the goods she sells, describing the makers of the products, the regions around the world in which they live and the craftwork of the artisan. Often the artisans are members of worker collectives, paying fair and steady wages in areas of extreme poverty, doing much to improve the lives of the artisans, especially women and their children.

"The basic human need is for connection," explains Barkmeier. "I feel that in telling these stories, they stress our similarities and our connections and bring us closer."

The variety in Barkmeier's store is impressive, making it a great location for those who enjoy shopping and especially for those purchasing gifts. This holiday season, consider giving gifts that connect you to those across the globe, celebrating their art and making the world a better place.





It's readily apparent that Benny DeWitt is a humble man. "I Lincoln'd it," he chuckles, referring to the fact that most of the people in the running for best tattoo artist work at the same place – New Age Tattoo and Piercings – splitting their votes and allowing him to rise to the top, much the same as our esteemed 16th president.

But also like Lincoln, no matter how he won, he is fit for the honor.

DeWitt grew up in a supportive environment; his mother a sign painter and tattoo artist. As an adult, he traveled the world, tattooing and learning as he went, finding out what styles he liked and what he didn't. Then he brought it all home and opened his own shop.

With no Main Street in Springfield, DeWitt set up on Monroe Street, in the heart of downtown, desiring a classy place in a classy area to showcase his talents.

"I see the efforts of everybody," says DeWitt, of the numerous unique and vibrant shops that have sprung up downtown in the last few years, and he is pleased to be in the midst of such creativity.

DeWitt apprenticed at New Age Tattoo for some time. Opening his own shop was not born of competition, but a desire to bring American traditional tattoo culture to Springfield.

"I wanted a place where I could share my vision of tattooing. I like to choose to work with people who are my friends. It's a huge motivation. I'm open to having different guest artists from all over coming to Springfield, which was not something happening before."

DeWitt opened his shop in 2019, with COVID making its way into our reality just a few months later. It was disheartening, but DeWitt dealt with the delay by creating and selling 120 paintings to pay the bills.

Now DeWitt has two tattoo artists renting space in his shop, Nick Demarco and Sam Myers. Though they tattoo in all styles, they specialize in the bold American traditional style, which DeWitt explains is characterized by "a bold black outline and full color. It's a little more simplified, so they age well."

The public is also invited to check out the art on the walls. Walk-ins are always welcome on Saturdays.

### **YMCA of Springfield**

It's obvious by the number of categories that the YMCA of Springfield either won or was a finalist in that both branches of the YMCA, Downtown and Kerasotes, are integral parts of our community.

Joey Greenwood, Downtown branch manager says, "It's a great feeling. I think the Y is so much more than just a gym. We say that a lot internally, and I think it's recognized by our members." Two important things contribute to this, says Greenwood, "our staff who are creating and staffing these programs, and just as important are the people who come in and utilize the facilities."

Springfield's first YMCA began in 1874. The focus of the Y has changed over the years, and it is now an important part of the lives of people who are looking to reach fitness goals and provide physical and cultural activities for their children as well those in need of quality childcare.

"We're fortunate to have had community support to build a facility with state-of-the-art everything. It's been fantastic," said Greenwood. The new Downtown Y opened in 2020.

The Kerasotes branch is currently undergoing its own expansion, with 14 acres of soccer fields being developed on land the Y owns near the branch. Greenwood says this will allow for additional youth and adult sports programming in 2023.

The Y also does a tremendous amount of community outreach. One example is the pop-up produce pantries on Wednesdays and Saturdays, taking produce donations from the downtown farmers market and offering it at the Y. To date, they've given away over 6,000 pounds of produce.

A partnership with the Matthew Project and generous donations through fundraising have allowed the Y to offer free summer camp placements to 50-60 kids, including meals and field trips.

The Springfield Police Department has partnered for a "Meat and Greet" with free hot dogs and a K-9 demonstration. The police also celebrated National Ice Cream Day at the Y. Greenwood notes it is important for children to realize the police department "is here to protect us and help us. They're doing a lot of good things for the community."

This holiday season, a tree will be set up at the Y for patrons to donate gifts to women and their families staying at Sojourn Shelter & Services.

"We definitely appreciate the support of our community, and without that support we would not be able to do what we do," said Greenwood. "A big thank you to all of our donors, because we could not reach the people we need to reach without them."

With all the Y does, it is easy to see why they won big in the Best of Springfield. But really, it is our community that wins.

# **Laketown Animal Hospital**

A hard-working staff, collaborative work environment and focus on customer service have paid dividends for Laketown Animal Hospital, which was voted best veterinary clinic in the 2022 Best of Springfield poll of *Illinois Times* readers.

"The vote is a really nice validation of what we do every day," said Dr. Bret Peterson, owner and veterinarian at the clinic at 1115 Adlai Stevenson Drive in Springfield. "I think we provide great-quality medicine and have a good reputation because of that. We've got a great support staff, too. Our staff is outstanding."

Laketown Animal Hospital has operated on the same corner on Springfield's south side since it first opened in 1962. It grew over the years under the ownership of Dr. Joseph Curry and later under the ownership of his son, Dr. Chris Curry.

Peterson purchased the practice from the younger Curry, now retired, in May 2018. Two other veterinarians practice at the clinic, which employs 37 people. Dr. Susan Fisherkeller has practiced there 42 years, and Dr. Aaron Felgenhauer joined more recently.

The clinic offers a wide range of services, from traditional examinations and urgent care to boarding and grooming.

Regular professional development for Laketown's veterinary technicians – also called nurses – means they can perform tasks such as blood draws, fluid administration and taking X-rays, freeing up veterinarians to focus on medical diagnoses and treatments and consult with other vets in the clinic, practice manager Jelena Peterson said.

Everyone on the staff – including the groomers and front-desk workers – are trained on good customer service and communication as they serve clients who may be going through stressful situations connected with the health of their beloved dogs and cats, she said.

"We invest in our staff," said Peterson, who is married to Bret Peterson. "People want a caring staff that loves their pets."

The number of pet owners seeking services has increased 30% since 2018 as word of mouth about the clinic has spread, said Bret Peterson, who has worked as a veterinarian for 16 years and previously was a high school science teacher in the Chicago area before changing careers.

The number of clients served by the clinic also rose during the COVID-19 pandemic as lockdowns and other restrictions resulted in more people staying home and looking for the companionship that pets can provide, the Petersons said.

"We're just really grateful for the clients we've had," Jelena Peterson said. "Our clientele is hard to beat."



She says it's a labor of love; their 15-year-old daughter has been tagging clothing all week because the store is in its busiest season of the year.

Glauberman said, "I love that we provide a great service to the community. Moms are able to style their kids for less money than they could otherwise, and I like that we are saving clothing from being put in a landfill." She said that as of mid-October, the Springfield store has purchased 350,000 pieces, and there's still a couple of months left in the year.

Twice yearly, Once Upon a Child has an end-of-season clearance sale when items are marked down to 90% off. Items remaining are donated to benefit children in need. Nothing is thrown away. It's a convenient and eco-friendly way to recycle children's items.

# **Springfield Art Association**

Springfield Art Association (SAA) is a community-based nonprofit that has been a mainstay of Springfield's north side for over 100 years. Located just north of downtown in the Enos Park neighborhood, SAA offers a variety of classes for all ages and summer camps for children and teens.

Children's art classes at SAA are creative and contemporary, producing original works of art that will be treasured by the artists and their families. Classes touch on a variety of media including clay, plaster, painting, fiber arts, collage and pencil.

Summer camps by SAA not only teach art basics and art exploration, but give children opportunities to socialize and be active. Want a camp with a support animal? You got it! Camps that touch on science, world history, architecture, cooking or culture? Yes, those are available, too.

Older children are given the opportunity to engage with history through SAA and Edwards Place, a historic house museum built in 1833. Camps with historical themes include toys, crafts, Civil War encampment, preserving food, embroidery and sewing, cooking and archeology. High school campers are given the opportunity to engage in public art in the form of painting murals off-site and crafting a large wooden troll at Lincoln Memorial Garden.

SAA operates two galleries. The M.G. Nelson Family Gallery is located on SAA's campus and features about 12 rotating exhibitions each year. Some exhibitions are yearly, such as the Central Illinois Scholastic Competition and works displayed by members of the Illinois Prairie Pastel Society. Others are one-of-a-kind, such as 2022's No Place to Show, in response to the Illinois State Fair's elimination of the professional artist exhibition and competition.

The SAA Collective, located in the historic Broadwell building downtown at 105 N. Fifth St., features the work of juried artist members with seven rotating exhibitions per year. Artists' work can be viewed online via artsy.net. The artwork showcased at the Collective gallery is for sale and features a vast variety of media. Both galleries are free and open to the public.

It is no surprise why SAA won Best of Springfield in three separate categories. This is an organization that leads in creativity and community engagement, for the benefit of us all.





### **Tyler Landess**



Now he's returning the favor as a generation of younger guitarists look up to Landess and consider him the best around. He's unpretentious, but a firecracker on stage who knows how to blow up a song in a good way and cites Jimi Hendrix as his greatest guitar influence, along with a roomful of other significant pickers in sixstring history. When Landess' fingers get a-flyin' so does his ginger hair, and then you just know the music is making it to take-off mode.

Now it seems that enough folks have seen, felt and enjoyed the power and reach of his artistry, and for that, congratulations, and thank you, TL, for being the best of 2022, with much more to come.

### **Locals Bar**

It's good to have a plan and even better when it falls into place and works, and the folks at Locals Bar in Pawnee can claim to have accomplished that mission. Located on the north side of the square in this small town about 15 miles south of Springfield and a few miles east of I-55, Locals worked to become a good music venue and the proof is in the pudding and the votes.

A first-time winner in this category, the well-built, nicely designed and always immaculate outdoor beer garden is the key to making this place the best around. Bands enjoy playing on the good-sized stage and patrons of the music can gather in a wrap-around balcony as well as a dance area and ground floor seating.

It doesn't hurt one bit that along with the good music, there's a finely stocked bar and deliciously good restaurant that's open late to entice listeners to the venue for more than the entertainment factor. An important aspect of the overall plan of the place was and is keeping things local, including fitting well into the existing downtown area and repurposing pieces from the previous establishments that once occupied the Locals space into the current building.

From solo acoustic acts and open mics on to up-and-comers just beginning to hit the stage and the most-established bands in the area, the word is out and the award is in that Locals in Pawnee is the best small venue around for live music. Even though the venue is only relatively small, the reaction is definitely big and appreciated among our readers, and those attending this fine and growing business that has a plan and makes it work.

### **BOOKSTORE (USED)**

### The Book Rack

The enduring popularity of ink-on-paper books and a helpful staff are what Tami Frye, owner of The Book Rack, pointed to as key to the success of her business and its selection as top used bookstore in the *Illinois Times* 2022 Best of Springfield contest.

"My employees are the best employees who have ever been," said Frye, a Riverton resident who has owned the store at 2943 W. White Oaks Drive in Springfield the past six years. "They love reading, and they love other people."

Frye, 62, operated Let's Make Dinner next door to The Book Rack for 11 years and got to know the previous owner of the store, Harland DeGroot, from whom she purchased it. She closed Let's Make Dinner a little over a year ago.

The Book Rack has seen a steady growth in revenues over the past six years "and in the last couple months, even more so," Frye said.

There seemed to be pent-up demand when the business reopened after being closed several weeks for a major remodeling project in August, she said. The store also was reorganized to make room for the range of titles it offers at half off the original cover price.

The store has more than 50,000 used books in categories that include romance, suspense, Christian and nonfiction. The Book Rack will buy used books brought in by customers and pay them in credit toward purchases at the store. The store doesn't accept textbooks or extremely old books.

Even though people can buy used books on Amazon.com and other online sites, and despite the growth of e-books that readers enjoy on their Kindles and iPads, Frye said many readers still like a traditional book they can hold in their hands. They also seem to prefer the in-person buying experience, she said.

The Book Rack doesn't do much advertising, she said.

"I think more people are finding us," she said, "and it's almost all by word of mouth."

Brunchfield has a wide variety of breakfast offerings, which of course includes your traditional eggs, omelettes, waffles and pancakes. But the cafe also offers its own spin on those classic items as well. Some of the unique options include the Benewaffdict (Belgium waffle, thick-cut ham, redeye gravy, poached eggs and Bearnaise sauce), Cajun omelette (open-faced with andouille sausage, bell peppers and onions, topped with Santa Fe sauce), and The B & J (two biscuits with sausage and special bacon-onion jam with choice of potato).

If you are going to Brunchfield for brunch, make sure to try their signature gumbo that is packed full of flavor. Another must-try is the cheesy bacon grits. Brunchfield also has an option to build your own sandwich, which many people appreciate, as they can get exactly what they want.

Aside from that, Brunchfield also offers burgers, chicken sandwiches, Reubens, muffulettas, Cubanos and the signature Springfield dish, The Shoe. Brunchfield's horseshoe comes with a choice of burger or chicken, toasted brioche, hand-cut fries and their cheddar-havarti-Guinness cheese sauce.



### **Anchors Away**

There's been a proliferation of Cajun seafood options in Springfield the past few years. This year, Anchors Away won the best spot for this category. It proves that you don't have to be close to the ocean, or even close to New Orleans, to have good Cajun and Creole food.


True to its name, Anchors Away has a seafaring vibe – low ceilings (which make you think you're in the fo'c'sle of a schooner from days gone by), dark wood and a fireplace. It's cozy and inviting.

Anchors Away features all of the typical Cajun dishes like barbecue shrimp (our favorite), po'boys, étouffée and gumbo. Other Southern dishes such as shrimp and grits are available, as are more standard items such as shrimp alfredo.

Where Anchors Away really shines, however, is with its seafood bags – all sorts of seafood cooked with Cajun spices, sausage potatoes and corn. Diners choose either shrimp, crab, mussels, lobster tail, clams or crawfish (make sure to suck the head – that's where the flavor is) and can customize their own level of heat. It's a ton of food and a messy dish to eat (don't be shy about putting on the bib that's provided) but it's well worth the effort – plus, it's fun.


