

Every year, we ask our opinionated readers to tell us about their favorite people, places and things in the Springfield area. Over the decades we've been doing this, we've continued to tweak both the process and the results issue to try to keep things fresh and interesting, and of course, the votes tend to reflect current trends. Last year, the category that received the most votes was TV personality, thanks to a show of community support for Joe Crain after he departed Channel 20. This year, we can only assume that people are eating their feelings during the pandemic as all 10 of the most popular categories are food-related, including best bakery, dessert and doughnut shop. The best place to go downtown involved getting food (Old Capitol Farmers Market) and both winners in the best new business categories were restaurants (Biscuits & Brunch and Jerk Shop

Wondering how all this works? Here are the answers to the most common questions we hear:

#### Q. Are the results real? Don't you just pick your advertisers to win?

A. The Best of Springfield results are based on what our readers chose as the best, which is not always the same as what our staff would prefer. Just ask the advertising department, there are many winners who have never spent a dime with us and others who frequently advertise but failed to win their category. While advertising helps remind people to vote for you, it certainly doesn't guarantee the outcome.

#### Q. Why did national companies or chain stores win some of the categories? If you're a locally owned business, shouldn't you support other locally owned businesses?

A. See previous answer. We encourage our readers to vote (and shop) local, but ultimately, we don't control the votes.

#### Q. What's up with the staff picks, if you're not choosing winners?

A. Staff picks are intended to be humorous or

thought-provoking but always focus on topics that were not part of the reader voting.

#### Q. Why wasn't \_\_\_\_\_ category included?

A. There are already more than 200 categories, so from a logistical perspective we have to consider the attention span of both the voters and readers. However, we do add and subtract categories based on reader interest and current events (we brought back the comedian category this year in response to reader requests and added several categories specific to the pandemic). Keep in mind that there needs to be at least four or five contenders in a category to make it competitive, so if you're asking for "Best battery store," "Best place to buy a musical instrument," or "Best auctioneer" (all actual requests we've had), we're taking that into consideration. If you think of a great category we've missed, email our associate publisher, James Bengfort, at jbengfort@ illinoistimes.com.

#### Q. Why wasn't \_ \_\_ one of the options when I voted?

A. We hold an initial nomination round beginning in mid-August. The top five vote-getters in each category move on to the final voting. So if you want to lobby for a particular person or business to win, the time to start is in the nomination round.


#### Q. Why don't all of the winners have a write up this year?





## New Oak Ridge Cemetery monuments

As land goes, the corner where two monuments to Springfield's biggest names have been installed since last year is prime real estate. Lashonda Fitch, cemetery director, pegs the price at \$72,000 per spot, each within eyeshot of Lincoln's tomb and at one of the graveyard's most-traveled intersections. It's a safe bet that the families of Richard Levi, founder of Levi, Ray and Shoup, and William Cellini, former head of the Illinois Department of Transportation who became a political powerbroker, invested considerably more on improvements.

The Levi memorial, erected late last year, now includes remains of a son and grandson, with room for others as need arises. The black granite came from a Pennsylvania quarry, says P.J. Staab, a local funeral director who designed the colonnade structure. "Each piece, it's like a fine grain of walnut or oak," says Staab, whose family plot is nearby.

The neighboring Cellini mausoleum, installed within the past three months, has no inhabitants. A plaque denoting Cellini's status as secretary of transportation under former Gov. Richard Ogilvie is affixed to stone near what will be Cellini's final resting place.



## Michael Madigan and ComEd

This is almost too easy. Early on, there was St. Patrick's Day Parade-Gate, wherein Mayor Jim Langfelder went bar-hopping, then was slow to cancel the city's parade. But Langfelder makes for a lousy villain, and he did come to his senses. Then came state Rep. Darren "Crown Prince of Coronavirus" Bailey, R-Maskless, who made all kinds of stir by suing the governor and getting himself removed from a House session for refusing to wear a mask. Bailey donned a mask the next day, national headlines already having been safely made – that's just a politician being a politician in rural Illinois, not a full-blown scandal.



# The Pharmacy Gallery & Art Space

What started as a creative crew of people, many college-aged, about a decade ago, has morphed into one of Springfield's premier artistic endeavors. Andrew Woolbright co-founded the group, back when it was on the corner of Pasfield Street and South Grand Avenue in a space that used to be a drugstore. Woolbright is an acclaimed artist with a conceptual mind that questions what art is in the first place. He's since moved from Springfield to pursue his passions, but the group he created lives on.

From the beginning, The Pharmacy Gallery & Art Space has maintained a cooperative spirit. Artists can join to access studio space and participate in group showings, classes and other events. Offerings last year included a fashion show, which was well attended and included outlandish and fantastical creations from artists of various stripes, including floral artist Hannah Malone and longtime Pharmacy member Wendy Allen.

Throughout its tenure the group has had core artists while also welcoming a rotating cast of unique and creative people into the fold. There are currently 20 artists with The Pharmacy, with space for about five more, according to president Janet Sgro. Sgro first got involved with The Pharmacy in 2012 and has seen it through evolutions and various gallery spaces. "The space is fantastic," she said of the relatively new location downtown at 623 E. Adams St. "We loved the space that we had at Fifth and Cook. It was beautiful. The building was fantastic. It was a precious time for us, but we really outgrew it."

The downtown space, near Recycled Records, has been a great fit. The studio has plenty of room for artists to carve out their own work areas, with room to spare for exhibitions. The space has the feel of a big city gallery and the atmosphere to match.

While the pandemic has thrown a wrench in many of the endeavors the collective would normally take on, there was an art show earlier in the month called Transformation, an apt title given The Pharmacy's ability to morph with the needs and desires of Springfield's art scene.

#### **BEST BASS PLAYER**

## Jessica Knight-Carnes

Jessica Knight-Carnes contains multitudes. When on a stage, she is a powerhouse, a short-haired spark plug of energy who sings – and sometimes borderline screams – poetic, existential lyrics. Not only is she a remarkable vocalist with a deep and dark range, she holds down the rhythm with her steady, solid bass playing. Some might find her remarkable for being a small-framed woman at the front of the band, one with a bass guitar about half the size of her, no less.

But Knight-Carnes is tired by the idea she's breaking convention by being female. She's an amazing musician. Period. And she wants others to feel empowered to play, no matter their gender or other attributes.

Looming, the band she is currently in, had its first release in 2013. Brandon, her husband, is the band's drummer, who also sings. The pair make quite the multitalented duo and the way their vocals mix is mesmerizing. Looming is likely the most visible group from Springfield's DIY (do it yourself) punk/Black Sheep Cafe/Dumb Records scene. It's also the most enduring out of a string of several bands Knight-Carnes has been in since around 2011.

She first picked up a bass at the behest of bandmates in the group Our Lady. "I started off just singing. And then my band lost their bass player ... and they were like, you can learn to play bass. You know the songs," Knight-Carnes reminisced with a laugh. "Now, I would rather call myself a bass player than a vocalist almost," she said. "I latched on to bass and it makes sense to me. And I think it's a lot of fun."

Knight-Carnes can shred, but she also knows how to appreciate gentler things. She's an anti-snob, humble to the core, and a huge fan of pop stars such as Lorde. She also loves the captivating harp playing, singing and songwriting of Joanna Newsom. Knight-Carnes said she especially appreciates those two artists "because they're characters and they're performers. I try to embody that even with playing bass; to me, it becomes a part of me and my character."

Also a millennial mom, Knight-Carnes juggles many roles. Her new endeavor, along with Brandon, is First Try Sessions, an initiative to get more guitars in the hands of young people. First Try facilitates instrument donations as well as lessons. "These small opportunities can mean everything," she said. "That's what changed things for me and a lot of people who play DIY music."

## Micah Walk

Few area songwriters have had more of an impact on the local music community than Girard native and now Springfield resident Micah Walk. Since his move to the capital city several years ago after a short stint in Chicago, he quickly settled into the area scene, performing steadily as a solo artist, with his Micah Walk Band and most recently as a member of the popular, award-winning, power Americana trio, The Deep Hollow, with fellow musicians Elizabeth Eckert and Dave Littrell.

Through years of teaching guitar and songwriting, his influence now reaches into the younger generation, as some of Walk's students can be seen performing out in local venues as well as participating professionally on a national level. The mild-mannered and highly talented singer, songwriter and guitarist stays busy playing music in some form or another for a good reason, as Walk is one of the few area musicians making a living from making music.

In addition to his acumen as a guitarist and ingenuity as a songwriter, he is also part of a kids' music duo called Tater Tots Rock and plays in one of Springfield's top cover show bands, The Shenanigans. It's enough proof of Walk's talent that he's received several Best of Springfield awards in years past from our discerning readers, but folks outside our area have also recognized his abilities.

In 2014, he released a solo album featuring a collection of his original songs through work with Grammy-nominated producer Jamie Candiloro. During the whirlwind year of 2020, our intrepid songster completed a Kickstarter crowdfunding project that allowed him to produce a new album (slated for release in 2021) in Nashville, Tennessee, with more heavy hitters in the music industry, including Sadler Vaden, guitarist of Jason Isbel's Grammy-award winning band, the 400 Unit. We all expect and anticipate more magnificent music to continue to come from the mind and fingers of Micah Walk for years to come.

## Dave Littrell

Since he jumped into the local music scene with the prog-indie-jam, all-original-rock band The Station, back at the turn of the century, Chatham's favorite native son, Dave Littrell, has played his horn and sang his songs for anyone who cares to listen. The readers of *Illinois Times* certainly recognized his ability to play his sweet saxophone and sing a song like nobody's business, but Littrell is also an accomplished performer on the guitar and is adept at handling bass, flute, percussion and keyboards.

A glance to past Best of Springfield issues demonstrates Littrell is a consistent winner in the horn category and also received Best Guitarist a few times as well as placing up there in the singer-songwriter category too. He first picked up the saxophone during his Chatham-Glenwood school days where he garnered All State Jazz Band honors, and he's been singing and accompanying himself on guitar for about as long as he can remember.

The versatile and talented musician spent most of the early 2000s on the road

touring with The Station, then hung around town more in the last decade playing plenty of hometown, selfsupporting gigs. He released a Dave Carter-produced, acoustic-based, solo album, Now I See (Planet Playground Records), in 2010, while continuing to work with the ever-evolving music of The Station. After combining forces with fellow singersongwriters and heralded local performers, Micah Walk and Elizabeth Eckert, to form the Americana trio The Deep Hollow, Littrell increased his musicianship abilities by adding bass drum and percussion to his role in the group, a feat he accomplished while simultaneously playing guitar and singing.

A dedicated family man, Littrell continues to play consistently with all variations of his bands, projects and combos, while balancing home life and his musical world, set on this notion of nurturing creativity and developing talent as an integral part of his personal and professional experience.

# Old Capitol Farmers Market

The Old Capitol Farmers Market has succeeded in putting on another fantastic season, satisfying customers and vendors alike, while also providing a safe place to access local foods and goods.

Though most social aspects of the market, such as musicians, cooking demonstrations, public workouts and eating have been absent this year, the open-air market has provided an abundance of fresh local produce, breads and desserts, packaged food creations, meat and eggs, coffee and teas and a variety of arts and crafts.

Face masks are required for anyone entering the market. Social distancing is encouraged, and customers are asked not to touch produce, but merely point to what they would like vendors to bag up for them. Two sanitation stations are available.

Cash is still accepted, along with credit and debit cards, but tokens are no longer provided. SNAP/EBT customers can use the new Healthy Ways scannable card in place of tokens and are able to utilize a grant which matches up to \$25 per day for use in buying fresh produce only.

Customers are asked to limit their numbers to one per household and not to bring children unless absolutely necessary. Pets are not allowed. High risk shoppers are encouraged to have another shop in their place, if possible, or to shop early.

Another option is a new online ordering and curbside pickup system that is now available to anyone at: https://www.localline.ca/old-capitol-farmers-market. Online ordering begins Tuesday morning, and orders must be placed by Thursday at 5 p.m. Pick up is available curbside between 10 and 10:30 Saturday mornings on Fifth Street between Washington and Adams (watch for signs).

The final Market of the season will take place this Saturday from 8 until 12:30, but there will be no Halloween at the Market this year. Street parking is still free at meters through the end of the year.

The Holiday Market is planned for Nov. 14 and 21 and Dec. 19 from 9 a.m.-12 p.m., both inside and outside of Anvil and Forge, 619 E. Washington. The same COVID safety measures will be in effect, including face masks for all and social distancing. Capacity inside will be limited. Curbside pickup will be offered the week of market.

## Grab-A-Java

For more than 20 years, the banners at Grab-A-Java have been catching the attention of motorists. Original owners Pete Lazare and Meg Evans opened the drive-thru coffee shop in 1996 on South Sixth Street, one of the first in our city to serve a quality brew and fancy coffee drinks.

Lazare bought mistinted cans of paint and painters' drop cloths and, despite his total lack of art experience, became a local phenomenon, making quirky, quippy and often timely and touching works of art. In 2004, Lazare and Evans built a second location on Hedley Road, with Lazare's banners again grabbing the eye of commuters and shoppers.

Lazare and Evans were in the process of selling the business to longtime customer William Legge in 2018 when Lazare fell ill with pancreatic cancer, passing away shortly after the business was sold.

Legge kept to the established business model, though admitted, "It became a struggle" at first to figure out how to put up new banners on a regular basis. Two years into owning Grab-A-Java, banners continue to remind passersby that few things in life are more satisfying than freshly brewed gourmet coffee and a witty visual joke.

"I couldn't be more pleased," says Legge. Banners at the Sixth Street location are primarily made by sibling artists Christy Freeman Stark and Troy Freeman. Christy Freeman Stark is a founding member of DIM Art House, a studio and gallery space which opened in 2019 on MacArthur Boulevard. Troy Freeman is the lead artist and founder of Free Sky Studios, which focuses on painting signs and murals, big and small. Banners at the Hedley location are primarily made by employees of the coffee shop. "They'll get together and have a paint night," says Legge.

Almost all of Lazare's banners were digitized, though some were too old and brittle to do so. A compendium coffee table book featuring 70 banners was created, with a release party originally set for March 2020. That was canceled, but will be rescheduled when "COVID numbers allow us to do it safely," remarks Laura Lipscomb, manager of the Hedley location. Pre-orders are still being taken on the website, and both books and posters will be available at the release party, which will hopefully happen in 2021.

Nor can that day in May erase decades of baked-in racial divide in municipal affairs that ended only when African Americans sued nearly 40 years ago to throw out a commissioner form of government that virtually guaranteed whites would run the city. But May 31, 2020, mattered nonetheless. George Floyd had just been slain in graphic detail, and the nation was both horrified and on edge.

In Springfield, no one expected what came to pass, many hundreds, if not thousands, of cars arriving for a parade around the courthouse promoted catchas-catch-can via social media. Police had to intervene, given the flood of cars, with officers directing traffic side-by-side with activists, and everyone working together. There was no pepper spray. No rubber bullets. No graffiti or fireworks or nut jobs dressed in camouflage and bearing assault rifles. There were, however, plenty of smiles, with every one of them signaling hope.

We were a city that came together, and we did a lot better than other cities did, at least for a few hours. We should hold onto that and remember, because May can sometimes seem like a long time ago.

## Mini O'Beirne **Crisis Nursery**

"One of the reasons I applied for this job is that I couldn't imagine a place so integral to our community being without an executive director at this time," says Jennifer McMillin, who took the helm of the Mini O'Beirne Crisis Nursery (MOCN) four short months ago. "I'm so grateful to be here to help."

For over 30 years, MOCN has been a steadfast part of our community, providing emergency childcare services. Over 2,000 children, from birth to age seven, are cared for each year by 13 full- and part-time staff, as well as community volunteers, at no

MOCN is named for founder Marinda "Mini" O'Beirne, who worked as an advocate for abused children. Though O'Beirne passed away before her dream of a crisis nursery could be fulfilled, a steering committee carried on her work, and MOCN is named in her honor.

In addition to emergency childcare, MOCN also provides other services free of charge: parent education classes and support groups, crisis counseling, medical and developmental screenings, follow-up home visits and referrals for food, clothing and shelter. MOCN's basic needs pantry provides diapers, wipes and formula. MOCN advocates for families, confronts racism and is committed to "building a future, both inside and outside our walls, that is more diverse, community-driven and equitable for all," as stated in a message from the board of directors.

"We've been affected by COVID," says McMillan, noting that volunteers are no longer allowed due to restrictions by state agencies. MOCN has altered its childcare schedule, allocating one staff person per family. Children can no longer play with unrelated children at MOCN.

"Even before COVID, we had to turn away families due to capacity," states McMillan. MOCN prioritizes those with immediate emergency needs and tries to work with scheduling to provide care for those with less immediate needs.

As many nonprofits look at creative ways of raising money without being able to host large fundraising events, McMillan notes, "We've been lucky, and the community knows how important our work is."

While the Children's Holiday Store, MOCN's biggest fundraiser, will not happen this year, McMillan says they will announce an alternative to this event in the coming weeks. "We're still able to meet our mission, and we are looking at other ways of raising funds."

## Ward 6 Ald. Kristin DiCenso

Ward 6 Ald. Kristin DiCenso is not everyone's cup of tea. She is not, for instance, welcome on the Sangamon County Board of Public Health, which has offered strange reasons to deny her a seat, even though she's been one of only two city representatives on the panel that's supposed to run a public agency that largely serves city residents.

Smart money says they don't like DiCenso because she speaks up when she sees things she doesn't like, and she hasn't liked the way that the health department handles animal control – she's suggested having a nonprofit step in. She's also pushed, hard, for the city to help residents in her ward whose homes have been impacted by railroad work, vowing not to vote for property-acquisition measures to allow rail work until the city helps her constituents.

We were bemused when DiCenso asked whether boaters need permits to fly flags and toot horns while tooling around Lake Springfield – the question was sparked by a boaters-for-Trump rally over Labor Day weekend that seemed harmless enough, given boats were six feet apart – but no one's perfect. DiCenso is a regular on social media, weighing in on fireworks and traffic issues and other things that mean real things to real people, and then demanding answers at city council meetings. That's what elected officials are supposed to do, and to see a city council member fight for constituents like DiCenso does should give everyone hope for the future.



# Rev. Martin Woulfe

Rev. Martin Woulfe grew up as a Roman Catholic in South Holland, a suburb of Chicago. He followed a long and winding road before landing in Springfield, where he heads the Abraham Lincoln Unitarian Universalist Congregation (ALUUC).

In 1980-'81 he studied abroad in Ireland. "I got involved with Amnesty International and joined a protest against apartheid in South Africa." Woulfe said the period of "great civil unrest" he witnessed "changed my trajectory." Later, he and his wife, Angela Aznarte, lived and worked at a group home for vulnerable youth in Chicago, and he spent years volunteering at a homeless shelter in the city. His life has remained committed to social justice.


He found the Unitarian Universalist religion to be in line with his values and was ordained in 2003, the same year he moved to Springfield with his wife and daughter, Celeste, to become the first full-time minister for ALUUC. He attended seminary at Meadville-Lombard Theological School and served as a chaplain at Northwestern Memorial Hospital while working toward his Master's in Divinity.

ALUUC membership has more than doubled since he arrived, to a current roster of 288. Services remain streamed online, due to the pandemic, though if you've been to any of the Black Lives Matter protests in town this year, you've probably seen Woulfe. During his tenure in Springfield he's been to countless rallies and protests, speaking at many. He and other congregants were visible proponents of the state's LGBTQ marriage law, among other human rights issues. "The majority of the more recent members tend to be younger and more drawn by our social justice activities," he said.

UUs follow basic principles, versus a certain religious leader. There are seven principles which include being good stewards of the planet, treating others with dignity and seeking truth and meaning. ALUUC accepts members who follow myriad faith traditions, or none at all.

Woulfe is an active member of the Greater Springfield Interfaith Association and also serves on the board of the Faith Coalition for the Common Good, among other affiliations. Anti-racism is a part of the congregation's mission. In partnership with Rev. Silas Johnson of Calvary Missionary Baptist Church, Woulfe and congregants have collaborated on a series of "sacred conversations" on

The congregation at 745 Woodside Rd. includes a prairie restoration area, as members, under Woulfe's eye, work to live out their mission of being responsible stewards of the earth while helping the community's moral arc bend toward justice.

With two stores in Springfield and one in Chatham, Land of Lincoln Goodwill, also, has had its travails, notably the firing of its CEO last year after a misguided attempt to fire disabled workers whom the agency is supposed to help.

But Goodwill has come back, and in good ways, aside from hiring a new chief executive officer. We were most impressed a few months ago, when stores opened after being shut down for weeks in the interest of public health. Experienced thrift store shoppers know that shopping carts are bad juju – they clog aisles, encourage overspending and can end lucky streaks: As soon as you fetch a cart because arms floweth over, you stop finding stuff. But carts weren't optional when Goodwill reopened. Why are you making everyone take a cart at the door, we asked? Because that's the best way to make sure there aren't too many people in the store – we only have so many carts, and when we run out, we know we're at capacity, we were told, plus carts help encourage social distancing. Made a ton of sense.

We didn't find any treasures that day, but we were impressed that a business that's gone through rough times spent time thinking about customers instead of just opening floodgates. They still have plenty of bread makers and Dockers and, if you're lucky, vintage Pendleton wool shirts and barely worn Norwegian split-toe bluchers by Alden crafted from genuine cordovan leather. Those with coronavirus blues can shop from couches by going to www.shopgoodwill.com, where such treasures as Kiss action figures and porcelain figurines of Ginger Rogers are featured.



"When I was very young, I loved science, and I loved helping people. My mom was a nurse," explains Dr. Cara Vasconcelles of her lifelong desire to be a doctor.

After graduating from Southern Illinois University School of Medicine in Springfield, Vasconcelles focused on a combination of internal medicine and pediatrics, which involved an extra year of training to take care of sicker patients.

"We used to see sicker kids in a hospital setting," she says, though now the focus has shifted to seeing them more in an outpatient setting.

Vasconcelles has a family practice, seeing patients who range from babies to age 99. "I see several families, sometimes adults and children with the same diseases, like celiac disease. It provides for a continuity of care."

When asked why she feels she was chosen as Springfield's best doctor, Vasconcelles replies, "I hope it's because I go the extra step. I think of my patients as family, as friends," explaining that when people are seen as people, doctors "tend to listen better and care better."

Vasconcelles, who lives in Springfield just minutes from her practice on Koke Mill Road, is active in her church and currently serves on a committee which focuses on COVID-19 guidelines to ensure safety for its members, as well as other committees

in her church. Previously, Vasconcelles was involved in her kids' booster clubs and volunteered alongside her children at St. John's Breadline, as well as at MERCY Communities, helping to set up single mothers in apartments.

Outside of work and community involvement, Vasconcelles is an avid exerciser, and among other things, enjoys walking her two dogs. She loves to read and is in a book club. A recent empty nester, Vasconcelles is relearning what life is like without daily mothering responsibilities. "I think I'm going to take up the guitar and art lessons," she ponders.

At work, Vasconcelles will continue to focus on her patients, making sure to listen closely and treat everyone with respect. "Sometimes that's what people need to feel physically and emotionally well," she said.

## **All teachers**

Teachers were never in it for the pay or accolades to begin with, and the pandemic has only added to the undercompensated chaos for many of them. Whether teaching remotely or in-person, the year has been unpredictable and full of new challenges. In March, all students were sent home under the governor's stay-at-home mandate. While parochial schools have sent kids and teachers back to the classroom, the Springfield public school district began the 2020- 21 school year remotely for all.

While the school day in District 186 has been somewhat abbreviated, to around five hours on average, that doesn't mean teachers have worked any less. Most would likely tell you they work longer days than ever. Countless hours go into lesson plans and mastering new technology, not to mention all the time spent on trouble-shooting said technology and working one-on-one with students who need extra support.

Teachers provide a public service while also caring for their own families and managing their own emergencies, as well as those of their students, pandemic or not. What has become crystal clear is their role is far beyond instructor alone, veering toward social worker. They make sure kids have food and other necessities. They check on students emotional well-being, which has been made harder these days. Meanwhile, they live with uncertainty, as it's unclear how the pandemic will proceed and what it will mean for schools.

With the goal of mitigating the spread of the new coronavirus, some teachers are scheduled to continue teaching remotely through at least the end of the calendar year. And even for those who do return to the classroom, the "new normal" is anything but normal

During a time where there are no easy answers, many still expect teachers to be full of them. Their steadfastness in leading the way and serving as stewards for our future deserves infinite appreciation.

#### **BEST USE OF PUBLIC FUNDS**

## **Rental assistance**

The pandemic has wreaked all sorts of havoc, especially for those already experiencing tenuous living conditions. Eviction moratoriums have bought time for those who have lost jobs or otherwise face economic hardship and can't pay rent. The governor has extended the moratorium through at least mid-November. Nationally, the Trump administration moved to ban evictions for many renters through the end of the year. The order was put through by the Centers for Disease Control as a way to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 in transient, homeless populations.

But, without the help of government funds, renters will still owe money, and landlords still want to collect to make their own ends meet. An eviction moratorium alone is unlikely to mitigate a housing crisis.

Meanwhile, in Springfield, the city had asked the community for suggestions on the best way to use funds provided by a \$799,000 Community Development Block Grant meant for COVID-19 relief. A need was expressed for help with rent payments and the city ultimately earmarked \$400,000 of the overall grant for rental assistance. Money goes directly to the landlord. As of Oct. 20, there was more than \$245,000 still available through the Springfield rental assistance program, which is a partnership between the city and the Springfield Urban League, according to a spokesperson for the city.

To qualify, the property must be within corporate limits in Springfield, the tenant must meet income guidelines, (\$42,800 or less for a single person), the tenant must prove a loss of income due to COVID-19 and the landlord must agree to participate in the program, which offers a maximum of \$1,000 per tenant. Tenants who need assistance can call the Springfield Urban League at 217-789-0830 on weekdays between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. They should specify that they are seeking assistance for rent within the city of Springfield.



PT's is not a sit-down restaurant but is instead a food stand where diners get everything to go. It's located in an old ice stand that PT's refashioned to fit its needs. Don't let that put you off – you would be doing yourself a disservice, as our readers have declared PT's as the best barbeque in town.

PT's puts heart into its cooking, and it shows. The menu is tight and focused — which allows PT's to focus on the barbeque and producing the best food possible for its customers. PT's smokers are located right outside the building so everyone who stops or passes by can take in the mouthwatering scents of its smoked offerings. PT's offers dinners which include two sides, sandwiches and "extras," which gives you the option to buy barbeque in bulk. The meat is nice and tender, has an appropriate smoke ring and delivers that smoked flavor that you expect in good barbeque which complements, rather than overwhelms. PT's homemade barbeque sauce has a kick of spice and it's a shame it's not bottled up and sold at the grocery store.

# **Carter's Fish Market**



Hot sauce and tartar sauce are available upon request. In the last few years, Carter's has also started frying up Asian carp in an effort to "move them out of the water and onto your plate." There are also sides available for purchase which include river fries (thick cut American-style fries), corn fritters, hush puppies and coleslaw. The sides are as generously sized as the orders of fish. Carter's doesn't skimp on food – it will not leave you hungry. For those who would like to cook up some catfish at home, it can be purchased inside the adjoining store along with the exact breading mix they use.

## Keith Louikinen Loukinens' on 4th

It takes some guts to brand a restaurant with your own name, but Loukinens' has the moxie to back it up. In case you don't know the back story, it's co-owned by Keith and Laurie Loukinen. Keith was formerly the food and beverage director at the Wyndham hotel downtown and was behind its signature restaurant, Nick & Nino's Penthouse Steakhouse. On our last few visits to Loukinens', Keith came out from the kitchen and made the rounds, visiting every table to make sure everyone was enjoying their dining experience. Judging from your votes this year, Springfield is definitely high on Loukinens'. It describes itself as "casual upscale dining" and "American cuisine with a twist." With dishes like spiced duck won tons and spiced tuna poke crisps, Loukinens' has certainly delivered on its promise.

The physical space is pleasing to the eye with tons of natural light, thanks to two walls of windows overlooking the governor's mansion. Décor is tasteful, clean and understated. Indoor tables are appropriately spaced to satisfy social distancing, and there's separate seating outside on the patio.

There's also dedicated lounge space with an impressive drink menu and ample seating, including several nooks conducive to smaller groups and a large meeting table where guests can gather with bigger groups. And with its revamped basement space, Loukinens' is well-suited for private gatherings and events up to 100 people with a separate, and equally attractive, banquet menu.

Food is top-notch, but don't think that everything is too fancy. There's enough on its menu to satisfy most any eater – covering the spectrum from sandwiches and burgers to diner-themed entrees. We're fans of the Maryland-style crab burger and the lobster mac and cheese. With its upscale, yet still accessible fare, Loukinens' certainly deserved your votes this year.



Hence the history tag line – and Sangamo's fairly large footprint does ooze brewery history, with nearly every inch of the walls festooned with all manner of breweriana. It truly is an impressive collection. But, with the onset of COVID, we think that Sangamo hit a home run with the addition of garage doors that open up to an outside beer garden. Couple that with plenty of light, and you've got a winning combination.

Sangamo's bar is impressive, as is its beer list, which is replete with Sangamo's own house brews and specialty cocktails. Thankfully, there are also non-craft alternatives for those who don't measure their worth by how much hops they can tolerate per each 12 ounces. Not sure what you want? Then order the taster or try a flight. If the weather cooperates, make sure to enjoy Sangamo's expansive outside beer garden. And if you need to soak up some of those drinks, Sangamo has a menu with plenty of options, but that isn't so large that consistency and quality suffer. Sangamo's focus is traditional microbrewery fare consisting primarily of appetizers, tacos, salads, shoes, sandwiches and baskets. Most items come with fries, but for an additional charge, diners can substitute in a variety of premium sides such as tater tots, onion rings, soup or cheese curds.

One of Sangamo's goals was to "achieve a must-go, must-see status as a Springfield and Illinois institution" by becoming the place that everyone in the area must visit and experience. Our readers certainly think Sangamo Brewing Co. nailed it.



"I'm proud of my staff," remarks Kammin, noting that four staff members have been working at the store for over 20 years. He trains staff well before they interact with customers on their own. "No need to wing it," he quips. Customers appreciate the long-standing relationships as well as the knowledge base of employees. "Having years of experience speaks volumes," Kammin says.

Home Plate Bar & Grill, located near the corner of Koke Mill and Ginger Creek on the west side of Springfield, embraces a baseball theme. For outdoor seating there is a lower patio area, along with an "upper deck" rooftop beer garden with seating. The patio area is heated and has several TVs so diners can still enjoy less COVID risk as the weather turns colder. Home Plate features happy hours from 3-6 p.m. Monday through Friday, and during football season it also runs food and drink specials all day on Sunday and Monday nights.

Our readers commented that something cool and unique about Home Plate is the old-school scoreboard listing the 24 draft beers currently offered. Plus, there's no shortage of large screen TVs to catch all of the games – it is the ultimate sports bar. Home Plate features central Illinois beers such as those from Destihl Brewery and Lil Beaver Brewery – something readers appreciated.

In keeping with the theme, Home Plate's menu is also a play on baseball terms: "pre-game" for appetizers and "the line-up" for entrees. One dish that has people coming back for more is Home Plate's chili. It is the perfect balance of flavors, a generous helping of meat and just the right amount of beans. The giant Bavarian soft pretzel tops out at a whopping 24 ounces and is served with cheese sauce and honey mustard – it's a home run in terms of flavor and size. It is best shared with a group, or you will definitely need a to-go box.

Home Plate has classic sports bar fare including burgers, brats, hot dogs and don't forget pizza. Pizza is a must. They also have some surprise features such as the charcuterie board and a spinach and roasted beet salad for those looking for something a little different. For those with a sweet tooth, be sure to try one of Home Plate's "extra innings" which include a classic root beer float made with the 1919 root beer that Home Plate keeps on tap. There is literally something for everyone's palette at Home Plate — which is why our readers voted it best new restaurant.

# Recycled Records

If downtown Springfield has a dorm room, it's somewhere in Recycled Records. Maybe in the basement – after all, downstairs is chockfull of couches and other furniture, making Recycled Records one of the few record stores on the planet where you can buy a chair, a lamp, speakers and everything else you need to replicate the famous blown-away poster from the 1980s produced to promote Maxell cassette tapes.

There is no truth to persistent rumors that Abraham Lincoln sawed boards for the wooden floor on the main level, but it would not be surprising, given the worn appearance and creak volume. Plenty of CDs and vinyl are for sale, of course, but equally intriguing are the jackets, lamps, neon signs, books, jewelry, postcards, lighters and just about anything else you can imagine tacked onto walls and stuffed in display cases. Owner Mark Kessler, along with his brother Gary, buys records and stereo equipment and practically anything else, legally, that he thinks he can resell, legally, and his tastes tilt delightfully weird.

He also knows his music, as does his staff: Recycled Records is not a place to play name-that-tune if you're betting big money, but it's a great spot to uncover impossible-to-find recordings and stuff you never imagined could exist. Hardcore record junkies will go directly to the second floor, which holds nothing but bin after bin after bin of vinyl, and you're usually alone. We recommend spoken-word driver education records from the 1960s. Pure bliss.



# **Biscuits & Brunch by Three Twigs**

Having just opened in May, Biscuits & Brunch by Three Twigs is very new to the Springfield scene but has already made quite a name for itself. It is no surprise, then, that it snagged a win for this category.

Biscuits & Brunch is a counter-service restaurant that focuses on classic brunch dishes, which are given their own unique spin, and everything is made from scratch. Biscuits & Brunch uses Three Twigs Bakery biscuits and also features a pastry case full of other delectable goodies from Three Twigs. One of the perks of owning multiple businesses is the type of synergy that owners Emily and Tim Lewis have going on here. In addition, the Lewises have now taken over the former CherryBerry space next door and transformed it into The Salted Lemon – Market & Creamery.

Biscuits & Brunch frequently features new dishes offered as daily specials, such as the recently featured all pastor pork biscuits (spicy pulled pork, guacamole, pickled red onions, cilantro and queso fresco, all on top of a buttermilk biscuit). Some of their regular offerings include the chicken biscuit (fried chicken biscuit sandwich with chipotle honey butter), the #basic (crushed black pepper bacon and cheesy egg scramble biscuit sandwich) and the lunch horseshoe (biscuit, protein of choice, hand-cut fries and smoked gouda cheese sauce). Don't pass up its famous "tomato potatoes" – smashed fried potatoes tossed in a house tomato vinaigrette and topped with scallions. They are a must try. The mac and cheese can be ordered as a side or as an entrée. Readers commented that it was some of the best they've had. We suggest you go for the entrée portion and add fried chicken to the top.

Biscuits & Brunch is currently open for breakfast and lunch hours only, but held a pop-up dinner earlier this month at the request of customers. Who doesn't love brunch for dinner? We hope they do it again.

They often have festive music blasting as well. One of our favorites is the jerk potato - which you can get with chicken, beef, tilapia or shrimp. It comes loaded with cheese, sour cream, onion, cilantro, lettuce and chives. The prices

are very reasonable and the portions on the larger size. Other notable dishes are the jerk egg rolls, which come with chicken, beef or shrimp and the jerk chicken Philly, which comes topped with provolone, mayo, green pepper and onion. For those watching their waistline, Jerk Shop offers a jerk salad which comes piled high with a protein of your choice. For those with a heartier appetite, Jerk Shop offers the "pick three" platter which comes with your choice of main entrée, two side choices and a drink for only \$10. That's a great bang for your buck as Jerk Shop already has generous portion sizes.

Jerk Shop definitely packs a punch when it comes to flavor and spice. We don't think there is a bad dish in the house. Jerk Shop also participates in Grubhub, Doordash and UberEats so you can get it delivered right to your door without ever having to leave the house or office for those looking for a tasty alternative to their everyday meals. Hopkins's daughter, Lindsey Selinger, is the third partner in the business, helping out with administrative and legal tasks as well as visioning.

A full schedule is back at FLOW Midwest, with basic, heated, restorative and flow yoga classes occurring seven days a week at the beautiful studio at 1921 W. Iles in Springfield. Occasional pop-up workshops are held with guest instructors. Krstulovich recently began a series called Self Care for Activists, to support those who are doing advocacy work on behalf of us all.

Krstulovich continues to hold virtual school breaks for kids, partnering with school districts to have 30-minute stretching and breathing breaks, which enhance learning and personal well-being. "We like to give kids tools for their toolbox," remarks Hopkins, with the idea of reaching kids before their stress levels become overwhelming. "We want to share these coping mechanisms with as many kids as possible."

FLOW Midwest is operating within COVID-19 restrictions, with social distancing in place. "We put stickers on the floor where people need to be, just like kindergarten," laughs Hopkins. Masks are required to enter the studio, though they may be removed once people are on their sticker.

Many participants join classes virtually. "We've had people tell us they look forward to their class every day," states Hopkins, noting that for those whose routines have been massively interrupted, yoga classes can provide the stability and regularity they need to maintain good mental and physical health.

"We've had to dig deep," remarks Hopkins about the challenges of 2020. "We've had to get creative. In day-to-day life, we're going to have roadblocks. We have to challenge ourselves to get through it and do what we can. We are resilient."

With a focus on making FLOW Midwest a space for people of all experience levels to feel safe and comfortable, Hopkins, Krstulovich and the rest of the instructors at FLOW Midwest welcome you to join them and find out why it was voted Springfield's best yoga studio.

# Amanda Wilde, RN, pediatrics nurse at SIU Medicine

Amanda Wilde humbly admits she finds it incredible to be chosen as Springfield's best nurse, particularly since she just graduated from nursing school in 2017. Wilde began her nursing career at St. John's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), where she worked with the most vulnerable of patients, premature babies. "We focused on respect, care, compassion and joy," she states, "and I've taken that philosophy with me.'

Wilde has been at at SIU Pediatrics for just over a year, working for a group of four physicians and alongside a fifth physician who treats newborn babies. She was personally impressed with the care of children at SIU Pediatrics and transferred the care of her own 19-month-old after she began working there and saw the doctors in action.

"The doctors at SIU go above and beyond," says Wilde.

SIU Pediatrics treats children from birth to age 18, though patients entering college may still be seen even after age 18. "We often do that first college physical," says Wilde. Children come in for well visits, such as physicals and immunizations, as well as for illnesses such as flu and strep throats and life's little surprises, like broken arms. She also sees chronically or critically ill children in the practice. "We see kids with G-tubes or trachs," she affirms.

"Sometimes these kids are scared just looking at the building from the outside, let alone walking through the doors," states Wilde. "I try to relate to them, to be very real. I treat every kid as if they were my own child, to help them get comfortable and to get down on their level."

Singing songs, making jokes and other acts of care are all part of the package. Parents obviously appreciate the efforts Wilde makes, as their voting reflects.


