# A love story about community journalism

Retired reporter writes book about multigenerational, family-owned newspapers

Dave Hoekstra has written a love story about community journalism in an age when many newspapers are dying and small towns are transforming.

The retired *Chicago Sun-Times* reporter traveled the nation talking to families that have operated newspapers for generations, an increasingly rare proposition as advertising dollars have shifted to the internet and conglomerates such as Gannett have swallowed once proud local institutions.

"I've done a few books, and the most successful one was one I did on Midwest supper clubs," said Hoekstra. "I wanted to explore multi-generational operations, what the struggles are to keep a third- and fourth-generation restaurant open in mostly rural areas. We did Wisconsin and Iowa. ... I wanted to use the same template to explore four- and five-generation family newspapers. I zeroed in on Hillsboro. I know the area a little bit. My mom's side of the family is from Taylorville."


*Beacons in the Darkness: Hope and Transformation Among America's Community Newspapers* was published Oct. 12 and also looks at newspapers in Texas, Iowa and Missouri.

One of the newspapers he visited was the *Journal-News* in Hillsboro. The paper has been owned by the Galer family for three generations.

John Galer has worked at the Hillsboro paper, which he owns with his wife Susie, for nearly half a century.

"It's a good book, but the whole situation with the newspaper industry is just depressing," Galer said.

A book party will be held at 7 p.m. Nov. 3 at the Historic Red Rooster Inn at 123 E. Seward St. in Hillsboro. The evening will feature a panel discussion celebrating the Hillsboro community and the importance of community journalism.

Hoekstra said it is appropriate that the event will be at the hotel that has been reimagined as a downtown hotel, apartment building,

taproom and distillery. The Red Rooster building turns 120 years old on Nov. 21. Just as that business has found a way to reinvent itself, many community newspapers have as well.

For example, in Marfa, Texas, a community of 1,700, the local newspaper has opened a coffee shop. A couple in their 30s from Brooklyn, New York, purchased the newspaper from an area family.

"They've got an operation where they have a gift shop, they have a coffee shop," Hoekstra said. "So, you go in and you pay your bill for the weekly newspaper and you go have a cup of coffee and you hang around

the newspaper office. That's tremendous. That's really making the paper a part of the community and lifting the curtain."

Galer said his twice-a-week newspaper has reinvented itself with a strong online edition.

"We now have as many online readers as we do print readers. But the reality is that most of our revenue is still coming from the print side of things," he said.

Classified advertising, which was once a wellspring of revenue, has slipped away to free online forums such as Facebook, Galer said. But he said the newspaper maintains excellent relationships with local businesses that continue to advertise with the *Journal-News*.

"I believe in the value of the advertising that we are providing them," he said.

Galer said his newspaper is focused on local news and has a better-staffed newsroom than many corporate-owned newspapers in much larger communities.

"I feel very disappointed at what's happened in some of those markets because continued, in-depth news coverage in those communities seems to be secondary for those operations when they're purchased."

Another newspaper Hoekstra examined was the *Carroll Times Herald* in Iowa.

Doug Burns, the owner of the *Times Herald*, said in a column written for the Iowa Dispatch that the decline of newspapers is the "central reason for the rot eating our democracy from the inside, the insatiable whipworm of a growing fascism."

Hoekstra wrote in the book, "Doug Burns was frustrated and tired. He told me he had considered suicide. He told me to go ahead and print that."

Burns wrote, "Dave's book is a love letter to America at its best, to towns large and small, and a cautionary tale about the proliferation of news deserts in which Americans don't know what they don't know about local government and the happenings around the block from them, not to mention in our courthouses and statehouses where the fourth estate is increasingly absent in a culture that values the whiz-bang silliness of Instagram influencers more than the grit of determined beat reporters on democracy's guard duty." □

# Gone with the wind

Lincoln foundation takes artifacts from ALPLM

One of the planet's most valuable collections of Abraham Lincoln artifacts has left the building, according to officials at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum.

The artifacts, which include such relics as a pair of bloody gloves that Lincoln wore to Ford's Theater and a cipher book that the Great Emancipator used as a boy, were removed from the museum on Monday, Chris Wills, ALPLM spokesman, confirmed. The artifacts, purchased for more than \$20 million by the Lincoln Presidential Foundation 15 years ago, were removed by the foundation upon expiration of a loan agreement between the museum and foundation and more than a year after the state cut ties with the foundation in the spring of 2021, according to Wills and ALPLM director Christina Shutt, who broke the news to museum staff and volunteers in an email.

"It is unknown whether the foundation will store these artifacts or whether the items will be publicly accessible in the future," Shutt wrote in her email. "Though it has been asked, the foundation has not provided this information."

Wills said that a Chicago auction company picked up the artifacts known as the Taper Collection – the original owner was Louise Taper, who was on the foundation board when the private nonprofit took out a loan to acquire the relics. The foundation years ago warned that the artifacts might have to be sold if the loan wasn't paid off.

"We have nothing from the Taper Collection still here," Wills said.

Foundation officials did not immediately return a voicemail message. The foundation in 2018 set a \$9.7 million goal to retire the debt when launching a GoFundMe page, which has since been shut down with \$35,000 raised.

In an unsigned statement posted on its website, the foundation wrote that the ALPLM and foundation "worked cooperatively to arrange for the orderly return of the collection."

The foundation board includes some of Illinois' most prominent movers and shakers, including former Gov. Jim Edgar, Sergio "Satch" Pecori, head of Hanson Professional Services in Springfield, Wayne Whalen, and Julie Cellini, a *State Journal-Register* First



Citizen and wife of Bill Cellini, a longtime political power broker who was convicted of corruption offenses committed while former Gov. Rod Blagojevich was in office.

In her email, Shutt wrote that government documents filed by the foundation, which she did not specify, show that the private nonprofit group has sufficient funds to pay off a loan taken out to acquire the collection. Wills said that the documents are 990s, the equivalent of 1040 tax returns, which must be filed with the Internal Revenue Service. According to its most recent publicly available 990 form, the foundation had more than \$24.7 million in net assets, including the Taper Collection, as of June 30, 2021, and had \$9.2 million in liabilities.

Before the state cut ties with the foundation, the private group had asked for state help in paying off the loan. The state accused the foundation of not providing adequate fiscal information about its operations; the foundation accused the state of spreading misinformation about the foundation and not negotiating in good faith to extend an agreement under which the ALPLM and foundation, once housed in state office space, had worked.

In addition to the cipher book, gloves and hundreds of other artifacts, the collection also includes a stovepipe hat with a provenance so questionable that the ALPLM quit displaying it. □

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# Adoptions are up, euthanizations down

Director cites improvements at Animal Control

It is a very exciting time at the Sangamon County Animal Control and Adoption Center. We feel it is important to share with the many pet owners and residents of Sangamon County the numerous changes we have made.

We are always looking for ways to improve in order to better serve all our clients, both two-legged and four-legged. We have done just that, and the details are listed below. The big highlight is that we have increased staffing and have significantly added resources, and focused more of those resources on animal care. We have a new expert panel of veterinarians assisting us, and we have hired our first ever Animal Care Manager. We have reinstated our volunteer program with a primary goal of animal enrichment, and the program is now being managed in-house by county staff with greater oversight. We look forward to growing that program as more applications are being received and processed. We have also made much-needed building improvements and provided additional training for staff.

Most importantly though, euthanizations are down and adoptions are up. This has truly been a team effort between animal control and outside organizations. We credit our many partner organizations who work closely with us to make sure that as many animals as possible find a new home. We have been fortunate to have so many existing and new partners and are always on the



lookout for more.

Under state law, our primary mandate is to protect the public from sick and dangerous animals. It is an important job. But we know that kennel care and pet adoption have also become an important part of what we do. We take all our responsibilities seriously, and we feel it shows. I am proud to say that Sangamon County has once again passed a state inspection with the highest score possible, for the third

straight time.

Other accomplishments:

- Continued significant reduction in euthanasia of animals, while continuing to provide the service at citizens' request and to provide humane accommodation for animals with terminal illness.
- Increased kennel staff, including a newly created position of animal care manager dedicated

solely to direct medical care for animals housed at the shelter.

- Enhanced funding for emergency medical care for shelter animals, with \$50,000 provided each year for emergency animal care for those cases beyond routine care.
- We have instituted additional professional training for shelter staff and volunteers that is based upon national standards and is being provided for by experts in the field.
- Created a Veterinarians Advisory Panel to provide additional regular input from local veterinarians on animal care and policies and procedures.
- Provided over \$500,000 in building improvements to the Animal Control and Adoption Center, creating a more comfortable and safe environment.
- Policies and procedures have been revamped to follow industry best practices, resulting in improved service areas such as animal adoption, volunteer participation and kennel cleaning.
- More transparency and reporting of data on the activities of the Animal Control and Adoption Center. □

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# Much confusion over Amendment 1

Voters will decide whether to amend the state constitution to protect organized labor

Some people have taken to calling it the stealth amendment: an effort to amend the Illinois Constitution in a manner that will benefit organized labor.

But just how it would work and what exactly it would do has many folks scratching their heads.

Amendment 1, which voters will decide Nov. 8, would amend the state constitution to make it easier for labor unions to maintain membership and to protect benefits of workers who are mostly employed by local and state governments.

If the constitution is amended, benefits for state and local workers would always ratchet upwards, said Chris Davis, president of the Illinois Chapter of the National Federation of Independent Businesses.

“It would put what is decided at the negotiating table ahead of state law itself,” he said. “We’re extremely concerned that whatever benefits are negotiated will then be constitutionally protected, and that legislators have abdicated financial regulatory responsibility. For example, let’s say a police union negotiates that body camera footage can’t be used in disciplinary actions against a police officer. Even if state law is changed allowing it to be used, what was negotiated in the contract will take precedence over state law.”

Matt Paprocki, treasurer of the Vote No on Amendment One Committee, is succinct in his objection: “It will raise your taxes.”

Paprocki, who is also president of the Illinois Policy Institute, said the cost of these ratcheted-up benefits that can never be diminished will be passed on to the taxpayers and they will see both their property and income taxes continue to rise.

Tim Drea, president of the Illinois AFL-CIO, countered that the amendment will spur prosperity and increase the overall tax base, making tax hikes less likely.

One thing both opponents and proponents of the measure agree on is that if the measure is passed, the Illinois General Assembly would never be able to pass a right-to-work law without again amending the constitution.

Right-to-work laws prohibit workers from paying mandatory fees to a union.

Supporters of right-to-work laws say it is unfair to force workers to pay a fee to a union they don’t want to belong to. But opponents counter that it is wrong for those workers

to receive benefits negotiated by the union without paying a representation fee.

Currently, 27 states have right-to-work laws. Nine states have enshrined the measure into their state constitutions. Illinois would be the first state to use its constitution to prohibit such a law, said Patrick Semmens, the vice president for the National Right to Work Legal Defense Foundation.

In 2018, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in *Janus vs. AFSCME*, a case originating in Springfield, that government workers could not be forced to pay money to a union, essentially imposing a right-to-work regime on all government workers in the nation.

Davis said he doesn’t anticipate there to be the political will to pass a right-to-work law in

Illinois anytime in his lifetime, so there is little need for an amendment ensuring it doesn’t happen.

But Joe Bowen, spokesman for the Workers’ Rights Amendment, has said political winds change over time and while the current legislature wouldn’t pass such a measure, it could happen in the future.

Amendment 1 has not captured nearly as many headlines – or political ads – as the unsuccessful push two years ago to pass a constitutional amendment creating a progressive income tax.

“This time we are working smarter – not harder,” said Mark Denzler, president and CEO of the Illinois Manufacturers’ Association. “We know we are going to be outspent by organized

labor so we are targeting specific populations to try and defeat it.”

Denzler declined to specify what tactics or demographics opponents are employing in their efforts to defeat the amendment. But he noted polling is showing it will be a tight vote.

“Nearly 70% of people have a positive view of unions, and it actually ranks higher than organized religion and other organizations,” Drea said. “So, labor unions have a high favorability. It’s a product of the pandemic – people saw abuses.”

Drea said some people were forced to work without personal protective equipment during the pandemic and the public has come to see a need for workers to have the ability to collectively bargain workplace safety matters with their employer.

“My view of this is you don’t necessarily have to have a contract or a union representing you for collective bargaining,” he said. “But if employees want to get together and go talk to the boss about grievances, they would have that right to do so. That happens a lot more than people realize. It’s like, ‘Hey, you guys, we need to change things. Let’s go talk to the boss.’ And the second thing it would do is create a fundamental right to a safe workplace.”

Denzler said the amendment is written so vaguely that he anticipates years of litigation to determine its scope if it were to pass.

Drea countered that constitutional language, by its very nature, is written broadly. He noted that the U.S. Constitution has lasted for more than two centuries because its broad language has allowed courts to uniquely interpret provisions over time.

One of the issues in question is whether all the provisions of the amendment would impact private-sector workers. The prevailing view seems to be that most private-sector workers are covered by the National Labor Relations Act, which would pre-empt state law. The NLRA allows states to decide for themselves on right-to-work laws.

Bowen said that while most private-sector workers are covered by the federal law, some are not. For example, farm workers, household employees and independent contractors are not covered. But this would provide them with the same rights as other workers. □

# More Democrats seeking seats on Sangamon County Board

Nine candidates are challenging Republican incumbents

Democrats hope to make inroads on the Sangamon County Board by fielding nine candidates who are challenging Republican incumbents in the Nov. 8 general election.

It's the highest number of challengers to GOP power on the board in the past 20 years, according to Bill Houlihan, Sangamon County Democratic chairman.

"I feel good about it," he said. "All these folks have a chance to win. These candidates have spent a lot of time on the weekends knocking on doors."

Incumbent Linda Fulgenzi, a Leland Grove resident, is facing a Democratic challenger in District 12 for the first time since she joined the board in 2007. "We as Republicans have never been challenged by Democrats as we are now," she said.

Sangamon County Board Chairman Andy Van Meter, a Springfield Republican, said he is optimistic his party will maintain majority control of the board, which Republicans have dominated for more than three decades.

"I think we have an excellent record of delivering top-notch services and carefully spending the taxpayers' dollars," he told *Illinois Times*.

Republicans currently hold 22 of the board's 29 seats, each elected by district. The board would flip to Democratic control in the unlikely event that all nine Democratic challengers defeat Republican incumbents.

The part-time jobs pay \$9,319 per year and represent districts that are home to about 6,700 people apiece.

All seats are up for election this year after redistricting in the wake of the 2020 Census; after that, board members will serve either two- or four-year terms.

The board controls the purse strings for county government, which operates with a budget between \$127 million and \$160 million and includes the sheriff's department, county jail, county health department, state's attorney, coroner, highway department, animal control center and a community action agency that assists the needy.

Van Meter, who has served on the board almost 30 years, faces Democratic challenger Maureen Bommarito in District 24.

Other incumbents facing challengers include: Republican Paul Truax vs. Democrat Chrisandra Brown in District 10; Fulgenzi vs. Democrat Marc Ayers in District 12; Republican Brad Miller vs. Democrat Mikaelah Curry in District 13; Republican Annette Fulgenzi vs. Democrat Aaron Tebrinke in District 17; Republican Alice Ramey vs. Democrat Vera Small in District 19; Republican George Preckwinkle vs. Democrat Krishna Brahmadam in District 25; Republican John O'Neill vs. Democrat Rusty Jones in District 26; and Republican Abe

Forsyth vs. Democrat Jon Hackler in District 27.

Houlihan, a former staff member for Illinois Senate Democrats and U.S. Sen. Dick Durbin, attributed the increased number of Democratic challengers to ongoing candidate recruitment efforts by the party that intensified under former county Democratic chair Doris Turner, now a state senator, and continued with Houlihan at the helm.

While residents in rural areas of the county tend to vote Republican, that's not always the case in Springfield neighborhoods, Houlihan said. "Springfield is trending bluer than it has in many years," he said.

The U.S. Supreme Court's June 24 decision to overturn the landmark *Roe v. Wade* decision that protected access to abortion has energized female volunteers and voters, benefiting the Democratic Party nationally and locally, Houlihan said.

Ayers, 37, a Springfield resident who is Illinois director for the Humane Society of the United States, a lobbyist and Democratic activist, said he wants to get on the board to improve the animal-control center and promote renewable energy and transparency.

This is his first try at elected office. He said he is confident of his chances of beating Fulgenzi for a two-year term after knocking on doors throughout the district, which has trended Democratic and includes parts of Springfield's west side, Jerome and Leland Grove. He said he has surpassed Fulgenzi in political fundraising.

Fulgenzi, a former grade-school teacher and former Leland Grove City Council member who wouldn't give her age, helps her husband and son run a construction and remodeling business. She said she has a "good feeling" about her chances.

Fulgenzi said she is vying for another term because "there are things that aren't finished that I have started." Fulgenzi said she has taken part in county committees planning for a recently announced multimillion-dollar upgrade of the health department building to create a "one-stop shop" for public health services, community assistance and job training.

She also wants to continue to help guide \$127 million in work that includes establishing a central transportation center and making improvements at the county building.

Brahmadam, 58, is a retired information technology manager for the state and naturalized U.S. citizen from India who has lived in Springfield more than 30 years. This is his first attempt at elected office. He said he's not afraid of challenging Preckwinkle, who has been on the board since 2007 and didn't respond to requests for comment.

"We need new thoughts on the board," Brahmadam said. "The sky's the limit in the United States of America." □

# Democrats hope abortion issue drives more voters to the polls

Republicans downplay the possibility, but Illinois Democrats and at least one veteran political observer believe the U.S. Supreme Court's June 24 decision to overturn Roe v. Wade will bring more pro-choice voters to the polls Nov. 8.

"Abortion is on the ballot. There's no doubt about it," state Rep. Elizabeth "Lisa" Hernandez, chairwoman of the Democratic Party of Illinois, told *Illinois Times*. "The 'choice' concern is resonating across Illinois. ... Women's reproductive rights are on the line, and we want to protect them."

The issue is even more intense in northeastern Illinois. How the Illinois Supreme Court will rule on cases involving abortion access after the fall of Roe is a major issue in races for two open seats on the high court in newly drawn Chicago-area judicial districts outside Cook County.

The outcome could result in Democrats losing their majority on the seven-member court.

Abortion will be on the minds of downstate voters, as well, according to Bill Houlihan, chairman of the Sangamon County Democratic Party. The U.S. Supreme Court decision ending the constitutional right to abortion nationwide is "going to have a gigantic effect on the Nov. 8 election," he said.

It's not clear how the issue will influence voters, but the Democratic Party probably will benefit because history has shown "a real pattern of winners getting complacent and losers reemerging and reorganizing," said Christopher Mooney, professor emeritus of political science at the University of Illinois Chicago.

The original Roe ruling in 1973 played a major role in the rise of the Moral Majority by Baptist minister Jerry Falwell Sr., the election of President Ronald Reagan in 1980, and the emergence of conservative activism among Catholics and evangelical Christians, Mooney said.

Data from election officials throughout the state so far show that vote-by-mail ballots cast by women are higher than men, and the gap between the genders is larger than in previous elections, Hernandez said. Houlihan said he is seeing the same trend in Sangamon County.

Hernandez and Houlihan said they believe this will result in more votes for pro-choice candidates.

Republicans have mostly remained silent on the implications of the Roe decision since it was issued, other than to say Democrats are advocating extreme pro-abortion policies.

Democratic messaging has remained strong, however. *The Washington Post* in late October reported that Democrats have "made protecting abortion rights the central theme of their pitch to voters in the midterms, and they have spent \$103 million on such ads in congressional races since Labor Day."

Democrats hope the issue and the enthusiasm

it is creating among female voters will be enough to counteract the traditional disadvantage for the party of the president in power during midterm elections, Mooney said.

Voters wanting to preserve Illinois' status as a supporter of patient choice in reproductive health care – including abortion with no waiting periods or the need for parental notification – are making their wishes clear as they answer the door to candidates and volunteer for the local Democratic Party, Houlihan said.

The issue is likely to play a role in the state's races for governor, U.S. senator, U.S. House and General Assembly, he said.

Even Democrats running for spots on the GOP-dominated Sangamon County Board could benefit, Houlihan said, especially if voters aren't familiar with certain candidates and want to support members of a party committed to a woman's right to choose.

Dianne Barghouti Hardwick, chairwoman of the Sangamon County Republican Central Committee, said Democrats' focus on abortion in the county, statewide and national races could backfire because voters appear to be more concerned about the economy, inflation and crime.


Moreover, Democrats hold a super-majority in the Illinois House and Senate, a lead that isn't likely to change much this year, she said. Because of that, she doubts candidates' stances on abortion matter to Illinois voters.

But Terry Cosgrove, president and chief executive officer of Chicago-based Personal PAC, a pro-choice advocacy group, said voters can weigh multiple issues at once when casting votes.

Houlihan said Republicans aren't "telling the full story on the economy." He pointed to reductions in gasoline prices, the unemployment rate and national debt. Hernandez pointed to decisions by the Democratic-controlled General Assembly and Gov. JB Pritzker, a Democrat, to authorize property- and income-tax rebates and a temporary suspension of the state sales tax on groceries.

Democrats' dominance in the legislature notwithstanding, Cosgrove said a Republican-majority on the Illinois Supreme Court could make abortion illegal by striking down the state's Reproductive Health Act, which strengthened abortion protections in 2019, and invalidate a 2017 state law requiring Illinois to cover abortions for Medicaid recipients. If Republicans gain control of Congress, they could pass national restrictions or a ban on abortions, he said.

Republican victories in Illinois could lead to eventual Republican control of the Illinois House, Senate and governor's office, which happened in the mid-1990s, Cosgrove said. □



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
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# Senate candidates explain their ads

Doris Turner and Sandy Hamilton pour money into campaigns for new 48th Senate District

It's less than a week before the Nov. 8 general election, and state Sen. Doris Turner is pushing back against political ads questioning her honesty and ethics.

The Springfield Democrat's campaign is airing an ad that says state Rep. Sandy Hamilton, R-Springfield, is "lying to you." It says Turner "helped the FBI" put a state employee in jail for crimes in cases that Hamilton's ads have said involved unethical behavior by Turner.

The Turner campaign ad says Hamilton, who is challenging Turner for a four-year term in the newly configured 48th Senate District, wants to "distract you from the fact that she's funded by an anti-abortion extremist who traveled the country working to ban abortion, even in cases of rape or incest."

The candidates are accusing each other of lying, misleading and distorting the other's stances, voting records and decisions as Illinois' most expensive state legislative race this campaign cycle nears its end.

Turner's ads responding to Hamilton's accusations of unethical conduct were followed by another pro-Hamilton ad, this one responding to Turner's response. "You know Doris Turner is lying because her lips are moving," the ad's narrator says.

More than \$5 million has been raised so far in the race, with Turner taking in \$3.8 million and Hamilton receiving \$1.5 million at last count. Much of the candidates' money has come from leaders of their parties and the parties' allies — labor unions for Turner and corporate interests for Hamilton.

"This is a lot of money for a state Senate race," said Alisa Kaplan, executive director of the nonpartisan group Reform for Illinois, which analyzes and summarizes campaign contributions for its Sunshine Database.

"What you're seeing is that Democrats are flush with money, and they're willing to spend it to protect their supermajority," Kaplan told *Illinois Times*. "The Republicans are trying to grab any seat that they can."

A recent poll by the political newsletter Capitol Fax found Turner and Hamilton's race to be a "dead heat" and "basically anyone's guess."

Both candidates were appointed to their current positions to fill vacancies in 2021, Turner in February and Hamilton in December. The job pays at least \$72,906 to represent a district that is home to about 217,000 people. The new district includes most of Springfield on the west, most of Decatur on the east and rural areas in Sangamon,

Christian and Macon counties.

Turner, 69, is a retired employee of the Illinois Department of Public Health. She served 10 years on the Sangamon County Board and almost 10 years on the Springfield City Council before her Senate appointment. She is married and the mother of two sons and a daughter, all grown.

Hamilton, 55, is a real estate agent, small-business owner and previously was a volleyball coach and standout high school and college volleyball player at University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. She is married and the mother of three sons.

Hamilton said she is running to promote lower taxes, a better environment for small businesses and law enforcement, and increased funding for mental health. Turner said she wants to continue to serve the community and has a "record of accomplishment throughout this community."

Campaign mailers from both sides are filling mailboxes throughout the district, and evening TV viewers are seeing back-to-back attack ads in the race, which has been called a toss-up based on previous votes for Democratic and Republican candidates for president, governor and U.S. Senate.

The Turner ad in which she said she worked with the FBI referred to the case of Homewood resident Quinshaunta Golden, former chief of staff for IDPH between 2003 and 2008. Golden was sentenced to an eight-year federal prison term in 2015 after her conviction for taking bribes and kickbacks related to \$13 million in grant and contract funds awarded at her discretion and for obstructing justice in a grand jury investigation.

Hamilton criticized Turner in ads for approving hundreds of thousands of grant dollars for nonprofits operated by Leon Dingle Jr. and his wife, Karin, both of Chicago, who later were convicted and sentenced to six and three years in federal prison, respectively.

Turner, who hasn't been charged with any crimes in this or any other cases, testified that she approved the money for the Dingles on orders from Golden, her boss. Instead of the intended purpose of \$3.4 million in grants to raise awareness of cancer and HIV in minority communities, the Dingles spent the money on luxury cars, homes, gifts and membership at a yacht club.

In a phone interview, Turner wouldn't comment specifically about other statements by Hamilton's campaign, including allegations that the FBI caught Turner "covering up" a payroll fraud scheme for which her husband, Cecil, and other former Illinois Secretary of State employees were convicted and served time in federal prison.

Doris Turner also wouldn't comment on a case highlighted by Hamilton in which the Illinois executive inspector general in 2014 said Turner "violated her duty" by failing to adequately monitor \$110,000 in state grants to the now-closed Tower of Refuge nonprofit in Springfield.

Turner's campaign manager, Dana Stoerger, said Turner cooperated with "all of the investigations."

Turner wouldn't comment on ads by Hamilton's campaigns pointing out late property tax payment fees paid by Doris and Cecil Turner between 1998 and 2019 and liens for unpaid income taxes that eventually were paid.

Turner said Hamilton doesn't want to talk about her own "anti-choice, union-busting" record.

"Instead, she's running these misleading attack ads, which is basically on track with what we've been seeing from extreme, right-wing conservatives throughout the state," Turner said. "These ads try to attribute the illegal activities of bad actors to me."

Turner said she has a "record of accomplishment throughout this entire community" and "championed ethics reform, imposing term limits on legislative leaders and banning ex-legislators from becoming lobbyists right after they leave office."

In her 20 months in the state Senate, she said she has fought for access to affordable health care and prescription drugs and protected the rights of labor unions. She said she "brought back hundreds of millions of dollars to this community — to Springfield, to Decatur."

Turner said she played a key role on the County Board in establishing the current site of the Sangamon County Department of Public Health on Springfield's east side.

Hamilton said her campaign's ads are responding to Turner's distortion of Hamilton's voting record.

"I didn't want to go negative," Hamilton said. "I'm not going to just sit there and take it."

Hamilton said she stands by the content of her ads.

Hamilton said Turner's ads incorrectly portray her as anti-union and willing to jeopardize public employee pensions and senior citizens' access to prescription drugs.

The Turner campaign ad that says Hamilton receives campaign funds from an "anti-abortion extremist" refers to Illinois Senate Minority Leader Dan McConchie, R-Hawthorn Woods.

The ad refers to McConchie's work before being elected to the Senate, when he was a vice president for Washington, D.C.-based Americans United for Life. The ad cites McConchie's support for passage of a Mississippi abortion ban after 20 weeks of pregnancy that was passed and enacted in 2014.

That was before Mississippi's 15-week abortion ban was enacted in 2018. The 2018 law became the basis for the U.S. Supreme Court's June 24 decision to overturn *Roe v. Wade*.

Hamilton said she is against abortion except to preserve the health of the mother and in cases of rape or incest. A spokeswoman for McConchie wouldn't outline McConchie's views on abortion. □



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
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# The humble, underappreciated parsnip

A fall frost warning announces the end of the road for most of the garden vegetables we've enjoyed over the summer. Happily, there are a few vegetables that reach their pinnacle of deliciousness when the cold weather arrives. Winter sweetening is a phenomenon that enhances the flavor of cole crops such as kale, collards and Brussels sprouts, along with root vegetables such as carrots, turnips, beets and parsnips.

Over the course of the growing season, these vegetables store up energy in the form of starches. When the temperatures start to drop, these starches are converted into sugars, which act as a natural antifreeze. Winter sweetening is especially profound with the humble, underappreciated parsnip.

I have to confess that I had never tasted a parsnip until about 10 years ago. Growing up, they just weren't a vegetable that showed up on my family's dinner table. During high school I worked in the produce department of our local grocery store, so I knew what they were, and we always kept parsnips in stock, but never really sold too many of them.

Parsnips look like large, beige-colored carrots, and indeed, they are a relative of the carrot. In their raw state, parsnips are almost inedible, but when cooked, they develop maximum flavor and sweetness. As a side dish, the sweetness of parsnips can offset bitter greens such as rapini. When caramelized, they become so sweet that they can even be used as a component in desserts.

Before the introduction of potatoes from the New World, parsnips were the main starch of choice in Europe. And when honey was scarce and before sugar became widely available, Europeans used parsnips to sweeten cakes and puddings. Parsnips ferment easily and were once used to make beer and wine.

When shopping for parsnips, look for ones that are medium-sized with a smooth skin. After peeling, small parsnips won't give you much to eat, and large parsnips have woody cores that need to be removed. Prepare them like you would carrots: peel the skin, and trim off both ends.

Because parsnips are so much wider at the top than the bottom, you should cut them in half crosswise, and then cut the fatter part lengthwise into halves or quarters. Parsnips, like apples, will oxidize if you leave them exposed to the air too long. If you won't be cooking them right away, submerge them in a bowl of water acidified with a little lemon juice or apple cider vinegar. If you will be steaming the parsnips, you don't need to peel them first. After they cool a bit, the skin will slip right off.

## Parsnip Pancakes

Serves 4

These pancakes made me fall in love with parsnips. Serve them with applesauce or as an accompaniment for roasts.

### Ingredients

2 cups of peeled, coarsely grated parsnips  
 ½ medium white onion, thinly sliced  
 1 large egg, beaten  
 1 tablespoon AP flour  
 1 teaspoon kosher salt  
 ⅛ teaspoon ground black pepper  
 Pinch of nutmeg  
 2 tablespoons olive oil

### Preparation

Place the onion and parsnips into a mixing bowl, add the egg and mix. Add the flour and just stir until blended. Add the salt, pepper and nutmeg.

Heat the olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Drop enough parsnip mixture into the pan to form 3-inch pancakes. Gently flatten with a spatula. (You may need to cook in batches.) Cook for 6-7 minutes per side, until golden. Transfer to paper towels to drain. Keep warm in a 200°F oven until ready to serve.

## Parsnip Puree

Great as a base for a roasted chicken or a hearty steak, or as a side all its own.

Serves 4 to 6

### Ingredients

2 tablespoons cold unsalted butter, divided  
 1 small yellow onion, chopped  
 Kosher salt  
 3 medium parsnips, chopped into ½-inch pieces  
 2 cups homemade chicken stock (or low-sodium store-bought)  
 2 tablespoons heavy cream  
 Juice of 1 lemon

### Preparation

In a saucepan over medium heat, melt 1 tablespoon of the butter. Add the onion, and season with a pinch of kosher salt. Lower the heat and slowly cook the onion, stirring occasionally, until translucent, about 5 minutes.

Add the parsnips and cook for another 5 minutes. Add the chicken stock and cream, bring to a simmer, and cook until the parsnips are soft and tender, about 20 minutes.

Transfer to a blender, cover with a towel and puree on high speed. With the blender still running, add the remaining tablespoon of cold butter and the

lemon juice. Season with salt to taste.

## Parsnip Cake with Orange Cream Cheese Frosting

Adapted from *Lucky Peach Presents Power Vegetables!: Turbocharged Recipes for Vegetables with Guts: A Cookbook* by Peter Meehan

### Ingredients

For the frosting:  
 2 sticks unsalted butter (at room temperature)  
 2 8-ounce packages cream cheese (at room temperature)  
 2 cups confectioner's sugar, sifted  
 2 teaspoons grated orange zest  
 Pinch of kosher salt

### For the cake:

3 eggs  
 1 cup sugar  
 ½ cup canola oil  
 ½ cup milk  
 1 teaspoon kosher salt  
 ½ teaspoon vanilla extract  
 1 ½ cups all-purpose flour  
 2 teaspoons baking powder  
 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon  
 ¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg  
 ¼ teaspoon ground allspice  
 ¼ teaspoon ground cloves  
 2 cups grated parsnips  
 1 teaspoon grated ginger

### Preparation

Make the frosting:

Place the butter in the bowl of a stand mixer with a paddle attachment and beat on medium-high until fluffy.

Add the cream cheese and beat until fluffy

Add the sugar, orange zest and salt and beat for 5 more minutes

### Make the cake:

Preheat oven to 350 ° F. Grease a 9 x 13-inch baking pan.

Whisk together the eggs, sugar, oil, milk, salt and vanilla in a large bowl until smooth.

Stir in the flour, baking powder, cinnamon, nutmeg, allspice and ground cloves and whisk together until smooth. Fold in the parsnips and ginger.

Pour the batter into the greased pan. Bake on the middle rack of the oven until a toothpick inserted into the center of the cake comes out clean, about 20-25 minutes.

Cool for 10 minutes, then remove from the pan and cool completely on a rack before frosting. □


